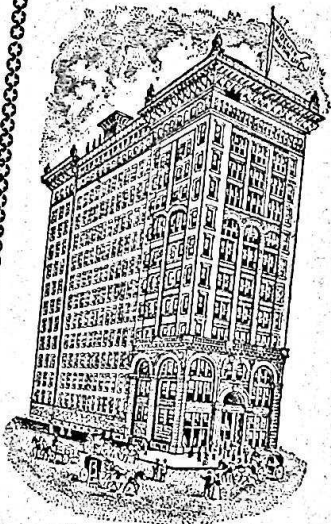

Daily Proceedings

FIRST DAY—Wednesday, March 25.

OPENING.—The Fortieth Annual Session of the Delaware Conference convened in the Mt. Zion Methodist Episcopal Church, Pocomoke City, Md., Bishop C. H. Fowler presiding at 9 a. m.

The 798th hymn "And are we yet Alive, To see each others face," was sung and the Bishop led in prayer. The sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered by Bishop Fowler assisted by the Presiding Elders.

ROLL-CALL.—The Secretary of the last session called the roll and 118 members and five probationers answered to their names.

DEATH ANNOUNCED.—When the name of I. J. Elbert was called his decease was announced.

Butler received sixty-two votes, W. F. Cotton thirty-three, F. J. Handy nineteen. F. H. Butler was declared elected. He was permitted and nominated the following:

STANDING COMMITTEES—On behalf of the presiding elders, J. R. Waters presented nominations for standing committees for 1903 which were confirmed. (See list.)

BAR.—On motion of J. R. Waters, Bar of the Conference was fixed so as to include the first eight seats from the altar.

HOURS.—On motion of J. H. Scott it was decided to meet at 8.30 a. m. and adjourn at 12 m. First half hour to be devoted to devotions.

ORDER OF THE DAY.—At the suggestion of the Bishop, by common consent it was agreed "That Friday at 10 a. m. the Order of the Day," be reception of the class into full membership.

VISIT TO PRINCESS ANNE ACADEMY.—J. R. Waters stated that arrangements could be made to visit Princess Anne Academy in a body Saturday afternoon. Dr. J. O. Spencer president of Morgan College and branches was introduced and addressed the Conference extending the invitation. Upon motion of A. R. Shockley the invitation was accepted.

RESOLUTION OF WELCOME.—W. C. Dickerson offered a resolution of welcome to Bishop Fowler which was adopted by a rising vote. (See Resolutions.)

SUNDAY SCHOOL ANNIVERSARY.—On motion of A. R. Shockley it was decided to recommend the matter of holding the Sunday School Anniversary on Thursday afternoon from 2 to 3 to the Committee on Public Worship.

Waters it was ordered that the case be tried in the A. M. E. Church at 3 p. m.

TIME EXTENDED.—On motion of J. H. B. Hubbard the time was extended.

ANNOUNCEMENTS.—The Secretary called the list of the various committees and they announced their meetings.

STATISTICAL SESSION ORDERED.—On motion of J. H. Scott it was ordered that when the Conference adjourn it adjourn to meet at 2 p. m. in statistical session. The Bishop appointed H. A. Monroe to preside and S. S. Jolly to conduct devotions.

TO CONDUCT DEVOTIONAL SERVICE.—The Bishop appointed A. L. Henry to conduct devotional service at tomorrow morning's session.

ADJOURNMENT.—Upon motion of J. H. B. Hubbard the Conference adjourned, Bishop Fowler pronouncing the benediction.

FIRST DAY—Afternoon Session.

At 2 p. m. the Conference was called to order by H. A. Monroe who presided by appointment of the Bishop. The devotional exercises were conducted by S. S. Jolly.

STATISTICAL REPORTS PRESENTED.—By direction of the President and Secretary called the roll of charges by Districts and the pastors presented their reports.

SECOND DAY—Thursday, March 26th.

H. Nutter, P. E. of the Wilmington District were called, their characters passed and they made their reports. The Bishop asked each "Is there anything against any effective elder on your district." The reply of each was "There is nothing against any effective elder on my district."

ROLL CALL.—The Secretary called the list of absentees at yesterday's session and four answered to their names. Upon motion of J. H. Scott the roll call was ordered dispensed with after today.

STATISTICAL REPORTS.—The Statistical Secretary called the names of pastors who had failed to report.

QUESTION 9.—The ninth question was taken up: "What members are in the studies of the fourth year?" C. E. Davis and T. A. Johnson were called, their characters passed and the usual representations made by their respective Presiding Elders. The registrar re-

ported their examinations passed. Upon motion of A. R. Shockley, C. E. Davis was credited with having completed the conference course of study, having been elected and ordained elder previously. Upon motion of J. H. Scott, T. A. Johnson was credited with having completed the conference course of study and elected to Elder's Orders.

QUESTION 8.—The 8th question: "What members are in the studies of the 3d year?" was taken up. C. H. Green, W. A. Hubbard, D. D. Turpeau, W. C. Bowland, D. W. Martin, J. L. Davis and J. M. Whittington were called, their characters passed, and upon being represented by their respective Presiding Elders, having passed their examinations were advanced to the studies of the 4th year.

QUESTION 5.—The 5th question: "Who have been continued on trial?" was taken up. J. U. King, M. C. Jennings and W. W. Gale were called. The characters of J. U. King and M. C. Jennings were passed. Upon motion of A. R. Shockley, M. C. Jennings and J. U. King were continued on trial and advanced to the studies of the second year, having passed their examinations. Upon motion of A. R. CASE OF F. C. WRIGHT.—By direction of the Bishop, the Secretary read a communication from the Judicial Conference, composed of the Triers of Appeals of the Wilmington, New Jersey and Newark Annual Conferences, held at Camden, N. J., June 10th, 1902, stating that the appeal of F. C. Wright from the judgment of the Select Number of the Delaware Annual Conference whereby he was expelled from the ministry and membership of the Methodist Episcopal Church, was considered and by a vote of nineteen (19), being the entire number present, the decision of said Select Number was reversed. The Bishop directed the Secretary to place the name of F. C. Wright upon the Conference Roll.

ADDRESSED THE CONFERENCE.—Dr. J. O. Spencer, President of Morgan College, Dr. Chas Rhodes Field, Agent of the Sunday School Union, and Bro. F. C. Clegg, Manager of the Philadelphia Conference Book Room, were introduced and spoke in the interest of their respective causes.

MINUTE COMMITTEE.—The Bishop requested that names of all pastors be called tomorrow morning who had not reported to the Minute Committee.

ANNOUNCEMENTS.—The Secretary read the list of committees and they announced their place and time of meetings.

ADJOURNMENT.—At noon the Conference adjourned by expiration of time and Bishop Fowler pronounced the benediction.

THIRD DAY—Friday March 27.

OPENING—The Conference convened at 8 30 o'clock the devotional service being conducted by I. H. White.

JOURNAL APPROVED.—The journal of the previous day's session was read and approved.

QUESTION 23.—The 23d question "Who are the Superannuated Preachers?" was taken up. J. Q. Dennis, Chas. Pullet, C. W. Young, J. W. Brown, E. W. Allen, Noah Morris, P. J. Adams, J. A. Scott, G. M. Landin, A. S. Amos, W. C. Dickerson, J. H. Pearce and C. A. Horsey were called, their characters passed and the same relation sustained.

QUESTION 30.—The 30th question "Where shall the next Conference be held?" was taken up. Upon nomination of C. A. Tindley, Bainbridge Street M. E. Church, Philadelphia, was selected.

COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.—Abraham Chase read the report of the Committee on Education and upon motion of J. H. Scott it was adopted.

COMMITTEE ON FREEDMEN'S AID SOCIETY.—P. O'Connell read the report of the Committee on Freedmen's Aid Society and upon motion of L. Y. Cox it was adopted.

FINDINGS OF THE SELECT NUMBER.—H. A. Monroe read the findings of the Select Number in the case of J. N. Waters and by the verdict signed by 12 of this number he was expelled from the ministry and membership of the M. E. Church.

RESOLUTIONS.—A resolution endorsing President Roosevelt's policy in reference to appointments was read by W. C. Dickerson, and on motion of W. C. Jason, was adopted. Upon request the Bishop and Secretary signed the resolution which was ordered to be forwarded to Washington.

A resolution endorsing President Spencer's plan for raising money for Morgan College, read by the Secretary, upon motion of A. R. Shockley was adopted. (See Resolutions.)

WESTERN BOOK CONCERN.—The Conference authorized E. H. Webb to collect the accounts of the Western Book Concern.

MONEY HELD FOR A CONFERENCE CLAIMANT.—H. A. Monroe stated that moneys belonging to a claimant were still in his possession because the rightful parties could not be found. A motion by C. A. Tindley that the Conference Stewards hold the money until claimant was found was amended by J. H. Scott so as to read that the Board of Stewards distribute the money this year. The amendment was adopted.

REPORTS.—The report of the committee on the sanctity of the Sabbath was read by A. S. Amos and adopted upon motion of D. A. Ridout. The report of the Committee on Temperance was read by G. R. Hollis and adopted by E. E. Parker.

Turner having passed their examinations were advanced in their studies and admitted into full membership, having been elected and ordained deacons previously.

QUESTION 4.—The 4th question was taken up "Who have been received on trial?" W. C. West, W. T. Purnell, C. E. Winston, and Littleton J. Waters were introduced and having passed their examinations after the usual reports representations by their respective Presiding Elders were received on trial.

CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS FUND.—Upon motion of S. S. Jolly the Conference ordered the appointment of a committee of ten to consist of the Presiding Elders and one member from each district to consider plans for the raising of a special fund for conference claimants at the next annual session which will be our 40th anniversary.

I. GARLAND PENN.—I. Garland Penn, Asst. General Secretary of the Epworth League, was introduced.

PHOTOGRAPH ORDERED.—Upon motion of J. H. B. Hubbard a photograph of the Conference was ordered taken.

CONDUCT DEVOTIONS.—The Bishop requested E. E. Parker to conduct devotional exercises tomorrow morning.

TIME EXTENDED.—The time was extended by common consent.

TO COLLECT AMOUNTS.—W. I. Bean was appointed to assist J. C. Dunn in collecting accounts for John Lanhan, of Baltimore.

CLOSING.—The Secretary called the list of committees and they announced their time and place of meetings and the Conference adjourned, Bishop Fowler pronouncing the benediction.

FOURTH DAY—Saturday, March 28th.

OPENING.—The Conference convened at 8.30 o'clock, E. E. Parker conducting the devotional exercises At 9 o'clock Bishop Fowler took the chair.

JOURNAL APPROVED.—The journal of the previous day's session was read and approved.

RECOGNITION OF ORDERS.—James H. Grinnage, of the First Colored Methodist Protestant Church was called and after giving satisfactory answers to the Disciplinary questions, upon motion of James H. Scott his orders as an elder were recognized.

TRANSFERS ANNOUNCED.—The transfer of Joseph H. Jenkins from the Washington to this Conference was announced; also the transfer of Frederick A. Cullen from the Delaware to the New York Conference.

CHARLES PULLET.—Charles Pullet, one of the two now living members of the Conference who were present at the organization of the body, was called and addressed the Conference.

SEXTON'S COLLECTION.—A collection for the sexton was taken up amounting to \$5.07.

CLOSING.—Upon motion of J. H. Scott it was ordered that upon the reading and approval of the journal and the reading of the appointments the Conference stand adjourned.

Presiding Elders' Reports.

Cambridge District.

To the Bishop and members of the Delaware Annual Conference:

DEAR FATHERS AND BRETHREN:—I present to you the following as my fourth annual report of the Cambridge District.

Through the kind Providence we have lost none of our pastors during the year by death, while some of them have been very much indisposed, all of them have recovered. Rev. A. F. Ennels and wife mourn the loss of their only daughter, Mrs. Estelle Woodard, also the Rev. W. T. Purnell and W. C. Bowland and their wives sustain the loss of their infant daughters.

Brother J. N. Waters left his work to which he was appointed last year by the Bishop about the fourteenth of November, 1902, without giving any notice of the same, by reason of this and other charges preferred against him, his case was duly investigated according to the discipline and by decision of the committee he was suspended until the session of the Conference.

The past year has been one of great opportunities, together with many adversities. At several points our churches were closed for some weeks on account of smallpox. The camp meetings still greatly hinder the general progress of our work. Many of our churches are deserted the whole summer and nearly all the fall. During that time many good opportunities for real spiritual and financial progress are lost and these conditions are beyond our control. The protracted storms during January and February also greatly hindered in the closing up of our year's work. In some parts of the District the people depend almost entirely upon the oyster trade and the stormy weather has been very much against them. Intemperance is also a mighty force in some localities to hinder and blight the prospects of many of our young people, and the onward march of the Church is thereby greatly impeded. But in those districts where local option and prohibition exist the conditions are much more prosperous and healthy. But regardless of the opposition the district has made advancement along all lines of the work.

We have had some good revival and many who have professed to be saved.

The whole number of converts reported from the various charges, 735, and the number of accessions 627.

The collections for the missionary cause are reported all raised in full and every charge in first class condition. The benevolent collections have all been looked after; and several charges are in advance of last year. Several churches and parsonages are in progress of erection and others have been renovated or remodeled and much of the indebtedness liquidated.

The Epworth Leagues in some of the charges are in a fair condition.

Number of chapters, 16; whole number of members in the chapters about 500.

The District League while it is still active it is not in a flourishing condition owing to various reasons. Classes of children formed for religious instruction 20.

The Sunday Schools are in a fair condition, but owing to the long distance that some of them have to go and bad traveling, many of the schools are suspended during the winter. Our Sunday Schools are are also very much neglected during the camp meeting season which is usually very long.

STATIONS AND CIRCUITS.

Aireys, D. W. Martin, pastor. There are four churches in this charge, all in a good condition, the new church purchased last year is nearly all paid for. The other churches are all free of debt, they have had a good revival and many conversions.

Beckwith, J. H. Winters, Supply. This charge is composed of three churches, two of them are in a fair condition, the other one is nearly deserted by reason of recent removals by death and otherwise. Much of the indebtedness has been paid and one of the churches renovated and several conversions. A site for a new church is also in contemplation.

Berlin Station, N. B. Snowden, pastor. This church was closed for some weeks on account of smallpox. The pastor has also suffered considerable during the year with illness, yet the old indebtedness has all been paid off and Conference collections all full and some conversion. The people here are loyal.

Bridgeville, L. T. Robbins, pastor. This charge is composed of three churches. There is some trouble at the church in Bridgeville, growing out of some mistake which was made year before last, which has caused some embarrassment in the work, yet a new parsonage has been built, the pastor being the master builder. A considerable amount of the debt has been raised and the benevolent collections nearly full and a large number of conversions.

Berlin Circuit, A. W. Lowber, pastor. This charge has three churches, all in fair condition. A new church is badly needed in South Berlin and the young people are all anxious to help but the older folks say that the old church is plenty good enough for them and so the improvements are hindered. There has been some conversion. The churches in this charge have also been closed by reason of smallpox. The Conference collections raised in part.

Cambridge Station, A. L. Martin, pastor. A good revival has been in progress here and many conversions. While the new church in progress is not yet completed over \$1200 has been raised toward the building during the year and harmony prevails and the people remain loyal. The Conference collections are all raised in full.

Cambridge Circuit. In the absence of Brother J. N. Waters who left this charge, Bro. W. C. Bowland, the pastor of Church Creek Circuit, was appointed to fill out the unexpired time by request of the officials and it being convenient for him. Before the former pastor left, the parsonage had been nicely remodeled and a part of the indebtedness raised, he also raised a part of his benevolent collections, the balance has been raised by Bro. Bowland. There have been also some conversions in the charge. There are three churches, all in a fair condition.

Cambridge Mission, William Allen, supply. This mission is progressing slowly at present for the want of a more commodious building. There is a bright prospect for a flourishing church here in the near future. They have raised \$5.00 for missions. Received on probation 6.

Church Creek, W. C. Bowland, pastor. A house and lot has been purchased in Church Creek for a parsonage and is partly paid for, the building is a good one with four rooms, and a very large lot well located. There is two churches in the charge. Benevolent collections are raised in full with some conversions and accessions.

Crapo, J. H. Cooper, supply. This charge has four churches. The parsonage has been nicely painted and the cornerstone laid for a new church at Liner's Road. Benevolent collections are all raised in full and some conversions and concessions. All of the churches are in a fair conditions.

East New Market, A. F. Ennels, pastor. This station has enjoyed a great outpouring of the spirit and a large ingathering of souls with a moral and spiritual transformation of the whole neighborhood. A mission church is in contemplation at Scott Town where there is already a mission Sunday School. The parsonage has been tastefully painted outside by a committee of ladies, headed by sister Catherine Ennels and all paid for. The Conference collections have been looked after and raised.

Federalsburg, W. J. Wilson, pastor. This charge has two churches, a new church is in progress near Smithville, Caroline county, Md., to take the place of the old one which has become entirely too small for the congregation, and money is being raised for the same. The work here is all in a good condition. There has been several conversions and accessions. Benevolent collections raised in full.

Frankford, R. S. Johns, supply. The work upon this charge is greatly improving. The membership has been very much increased and parsonage debt reduced and the Conference collections attended to.

Harrington, Charles Earl, supply. There are three churches in this charge, two of them are in a fair condition, but the church at Harrington is very much in debt both to the Church Extension Society and to the Building and Loan Association and other parties but Bro. Earl has managed to catch up with the payments in the Building and Loan and reduce some of the other debts. They have also had a revival and quite a large number of conversions and accessions, and the benevolent collections far in advance of last year.

Hurlock, C. J. Hall, pastor. Bro. Hall has overcome some disadvantages that confronted him on entering this charge last year and has gained the confidence of the people and is paying off that old long standing Church Extension debt at Washington Church as no one else has been able to do, besides reducing the other indebtedness in the charge. They have also had quite a number of conversions and accessions. The benevolent collections raised in part.

Laurel, C. E. Hemsley, pastor. The audience room and exterior part of the church has been nicely renovated and a very fine new parsonage has been built, two story with six rooms, front and side porches and other modern improvements. The indebtedness for the above improvements has been greatly reduced. The Conference collections raised in full. Some conversions and accessions.

Lewes, P. W. Price pastor. The debt on the parsonage has been greatly reduced. The benevolent collections looked after. A few conversions and accessions.

Lincoln, C. L. Anderson, pastor. There are two churches in this charge, the work is all in a good condition. The parsonage has been nicely repaired and painted. Several conversions and accessions. The benevolent collections all raised in full.

Linkwood and Vienna, L. E. Toulson, pastor. A great revival has been enjoyed at Vienna, which resulted in a large number of con-

versions and accessions. The indebtedness is greatly reduced and benevolent collections raised. This charge has four churches, all in a fair condition.

Madison, C. H. Green, pastor. This charge has four churches and one in process of building at Harrisville. The work is in a good condition, a new parsonage is in contemplation. There is an advancement in the Conference collections over last year. They have had quite a large number of conversions and accessions.

Mardela Springs, G. W. Downs, pastor. This charge has four churches, a new is badly needed at two points. The church has been greatly revived spiritually and a large number of conversions and accessions. The Conference collections are all raised in full. The charge is in a good financial condition.

Milford, W. I. Bean, pastor. This charge is heavily in debt. The pastor has worked hard under quite unfavorable circumstances. The interest on the debt is paid up and some floating debts reduced. The Conference collections raised and some conversions and accessions.

Milton Mission, W. C. West, pastor. This is a small point but has done well considering its chance. The membership has been increased, the apportionments for Conference collections are all raised in full and the church free of debt.

Nassau and Rehoboth, F. J. Lee, pastor. This charge has two churches. The charge is in a fair condition, the debts on churches and parsonages are being reduced. They have had a number of conversions and accessions to the church. The churches being closed for a while on the account of smallpox hindered the progress of the work to some extent. The opposition at Rehoboth is all a thing of the past, they have all united with our church and peace and harmony prevails. The Conference collections have been attended to.

Preston, J. M. Whittington, Pastor. There are three churches in this charge, all in a good condition. A great revival has been in progress here and many souls brought to Christ, the church wonderfully quickened. The parsonage has been nicely painted and renovated and the indebtedness greatly reduced. The benevolent collections looked after.

Seaford, T. W. Cooper, pastor. This charge is composed of four churches. There has been quite a number of conversions and accessions to the church. The old parsonage debt of long standing has been all paid off and the mortgage held by the Church Extension Society lifted. The benevolent causes have been attended to.

Trinity, W. T. Purnell, supply. There are three churches in this charge and two of them have a very small membership. A four-room house with several acres of land, mostly in timber, has been purchased by the charge for a parsonage. This property was bought at a very low figure and is nearly all paid for. The benevolent collections are raised. There has been some conversions and accessions.

Whaleyville, W. J. Hudson, supply. This charge has three churches and the charge is progressing slowly. The debts have been reduced, there has been some conversions and accessions. The benevolent collections raised.

Peace and harmony reign between the brethren and myself and I hereby return my most heartfelt thanks to the pastors and people of the Cambridge District for their very great kindness which they have manifested toward me through another year and for their most hearty co-operation in the work of the District. Our watchword is onward to victory and our motto inscribed on our banners is the whole world for Christ.

*Annual Minutes of the
Wilmington District.*

To the Bishop and members of the Delaware Conference:

DEAR FATHERS AND BRETHREN BELOVED:—In presenting this my first annual report of the work of the Wilmington District I am constrained first of all to acknowledge my profound gratitude to Almighty God my Heavenly Father for his benign goodness to me in blessing me with an abiding sense of his love and care and with better health than I have enjoyed in any year during my ministry, thus enabling me to perform my duties, without failing to be present at a single Quarterly Conference or meeting during the year on account of sickness. I am also very grateful to the pastors and their families, and the laity in general for the cordial reception and kind hospitality everywhere accorded me, and amid the toils, cares, and vicissitudes of the year, the hearty sympathy, confidence and co operation of the loyal pastors and people have made the work of the District, while one of incessant labor and travel, yet with with the blessings of God both pleasant and successful. Too much credit cannot well be given my worthy and popular predecessor for the excellent condition in which I found the work of the District as a result of his three years administration.

The long and memorable coal strike with its resultant scarcity and high prices of fuel; the numerous rainy Sundays, preventing church-going, together with smallpox and diphtheria, epidemic on some of the charges causing the closing of churches for weeks and in some places for months, have greatly hindered the progress of the work this year. Notwithstanding these unusual obstacles, the good and loyal people of the Wilmington District, led on by a consecrated, self-sacrificing and heroic band of Gospel ministers, heading their Divine Captain's command, "Go Forward," have so labored and struggled in the Master's name, that the District has not only held its own this year, but will report advancement over previous years, especially showing an increase in number of Sunday Schools, Church membership and benevolences.

DEATHS.

On April 11th, last year, during Conference session in Janes M. E. Church, Germantown, while the Conference was considering the question, "Where shall the next Conference be held?" preparing to come to Pocomoke, Bro. I. J. Elbert was stricken down with paralysis, casting an awful gloom over the Conference. He was taken to the Germantown Hospital, where, after lingering twelve days, he was called by his Master from labor to reward. A suitable memoir will be read by Bro J. R. Brown. While death has saddened many homes on the District during the year, God has mercifully spared the homes of the pastors, Bros. W. H. Turner, R. G. Waters and J. E. Webb each have suffered severe attacks of illness during the year. Among others who have been sick are the following Sisters J. E. Webb and A. J. Wallace, and my own son, Marshall D. Nutter, who has been critically ill for the past four weeks.

PRUNING CHURCH RECORDS.

The work of pruning Church and Sunday School Records still goes on. While we acknowledge there should be an honest effort to have the records as accurate as possible, we fear that in some cases this pruning is done in a manner and to an extent and for purposes not authorized by the Discipline.

IMPROVING CHURCH PROPERTY.

We rejoice that there is a growing desire for neat and comfortable churches and parsonages. Our people are securing better homes.

And with the increase of education and refinement some of the old and inelegant churches and parsonages will either be nicely remodeled and improved or replaced by better and more commodious ones.

CAMP MEETINGS.

With every careful and thoughtful observer of our modern Camp meetings the conviction deepens that they ought either to be reformed or abandoned. I have not a word to say against camp meetings properly conducted, in harmony with the righteous laws of God and the good laws of man, so as to promote the salvation of souls and the glory of God. But in too many instances the only object seems to be to draw the crowd, make money and to have a good time regardless of the moral and spiritual effects upon the community. They should be reformed especially by eliminating Sabbath desecration and all-night services which tend to demoralize our young people and to ruin their soul and body for time and eternity.

TEMPERANCE.

The friends of the saloon and the liquor traffic were perhaps never so well organized and strongly united in their support of their unholy cause and against the cause of temperance reform as now. The liquor power is the inveterate foe of the Church of God, the home and of everything that is good. It is perhaps the most complete embodiment of cruel, conscientious, loveless, selfishness mankind has yet shown. As we should do, we are sending our money by the millions to convert the heathen nations; yet as we should not do, we tolerate in our own land this institution which involves more of folly and sin and cruelty and shame than all of the abominable idolatries and superstitions of the pagan world. We rejoice over the victory won by the friends of temperance in securing local option in Cecil county, Maryland, last fall, and for the efforts being put forth in Delaware to secure local option. Let us in the name of God unite and organize all our forces in the cause of temperance reform.

EDUCATION.

The demands for an educated ministry and for Christian and industrial education for the masses were never so great and urgent as now. Those who are aspiring to be ministers, teachers, leaders of the people and successful in business, should realize the situation and avail themselves of the advantages of the schools and thoroughly prepare themselves for their vocation or expect to fail in their pursuit and soon be relegated to the rear.

We point with pride to Morgan College, Baltimore, Maryland, Rev. J. O. Spencer, Ph. D., the honored president, and to Princess Anne Academy, the Eastern Branch of the Maryland Agricultural College, Prof. Frank Trigg, A. M., the energetic principal, our own institutions of learning, which afford excellent facilities and opportunities on easy terms to our sons and daughters to secure an education both Christian and industrial, and prepare themselves as preachers, teachers, farmers, wagon-makers, blacksmiths, carpenters, painters, cooks and good house-keepers.

We also with delight point to the Delaware State College for Colored Students at Dover, Delaware, with the Rev. W. C. Jason, A. M. as its able and efficient president; to the Howard School, Wilmington, Delaware, Miss Edwina B. Kruse, A. M., principal, as institutions affording excellent opportunities for the education of our young people. These together with the public schools put education within the reach of all, so that there will be no excuse if our boys and girls grow up without a good education.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

In my Quarterly visits I have endeavored to emphasize the importance of the Sunday School. Too much attention can not well be given by the pastor and all who have the moral and Christian training of children and youth at heart. Faithful effort should be made to keep open the Sunday School all the year, both winter and summer, and the Bible and Catechism, best hymn books, including the hymnal and our own church literature should be faithfully used, and the disciplinary regulations observed.

Pastors should regularly from their pulpits invite the young people and adults to attend the Sunday School, urge upon parents to send their children regularly and punctually, and to know that they attend when sent, and as often as possible for the parents to accompany them. The lessons should not only be well studied and taught in the Sunday Schools, but pastors, teachers and parents should seek the early conversion and salvation of every child.

EPWORTH LEAGUE.

The Epworth League well organized and properly conducted can be made a great power for good in any community; and as far as possible the pastor should see that one is organized and maintained in every church. Some of the chapters on the District are strong and doing good work, while others are wholly or partially inactive. The District League Convention held at New Castle last July was a successful and interesting one. The outlook on the District for Epworth League work is brighter, and we hope for a genuine revival in this department of church activities.

MINISTERIAL SUPPORT AND BENEVOLENCES.

Most of the churches underestimate the amount needed to furnish a comfortable support for the pastors and their families and sometimes do not take into consideration the number and condition of the pastor's family. Consequently some of our pastors and their families are compelled to make many sacrifices and sometimes suffer untold privations while the pastor is conscientiously laboring and striving to perform his duties, and to administer to the spiritual comforts and needs of the people he is appointed to serve. He is under sacred obligations to employ all his time in the work of the ministry, and cannot in keeping with his promise engage in secular pursuits for a livelihood. Jesus says the laborer is worthy of his hire, therefore, the churches should keenly feel their sacred duty to see that the salary of the pastor is regularly and promptly paid. Not only will the ministerial support be raised in full but also the apportionment for the benevolences, when every pastor shall lovingly and faithfully teach, and every member willingly and truly observe the membership financial obligation: "I will contribute of my earthly substance according to my ability to the support of the Gospel and the various benevolent enterprises of the church." I have endeavored to impress these considerations on the people, and a number of the charges will report benevolent apportionments and ministerial support raised in full, and in one case, viz., Port Deposit, not only was the estimate of the pastor's salary increased \$100 00 this year, but \$30.00 above the estimate was raised and the benevolences advanced \$25 00.

SUMMARY OF THE WORK.

Barclay Charge embraces two churches. Bro. Jas. R. Haywood who was appointed at the Conference to supply this charge, failing to secure an adequate support, left the charge about the middle of October, and I removed Bro. W. H. Johns who was supplying Camden and

appointed him to supply this charge October 24th. Since this date the charge reports 8 converts, \$30 raised on benevolences, and \$140 on old indebtedness. The people love the young and energetic pastor and ask his return another year.

2. Camden has only one small church with 18 members and was formally a part of Dover Circuit. It cannot support a pastor and I think should again be attached to Dover Circuit. Bro. Johns, who was a student of the Dover State College, served this charge as a supply until October 24th, and did a good work, since which time it has been supplied by Bro. Charles F. Dingus, a student of the same institution who has rendered faithful service. It reports \$20 raised for improvements and \$18 for benevolences.

3. Catlin Charge, Rev. S. T. Parker, pastor, embraces two churches with a good parsonage. This a growing charge and the outlook bright. The pastor and people deserve credit for the successful year's work. Converts, 10; raised on old debts, \$80; for improvements, \$132; the benevolent collections taken and in advance of last year.

4. Christiana and Hochessan supplied by Bro. Joseph N. Brown, consists of two small societies with one good church at Christiana and a small temporary mission at Hochessan. The people are anxious for a church and have bought a lot and a foundation for a new church was laid over a year ago. It is hoped that during another year a new church will be erected. The pastor with feeble health has done the best he could with some good results. Raised on old debts, \$49.50; for benevolences, \$8. There were three conversions.

Chesterville has one church and a small mission. Bro. B. F. Lowber is serving his fifth year as supply on this charge. He has preached the Gospel and labored for the good of the people. Raised on old debts, \$43; on benevolences, \$30. There were 13 conversions.

6. Cheswold, Bro. Wm. H. Turner, pastor. This charge has been afflicted with the epidemic of smallpox during the winter and many of the members suffered from this disease. But thank God, but few if any of the members died from its effects. This epidemic, together with the unusual number of rainy Sundays, greatly hindered the work. Conversions, 7; raised on improvements, \$29; on old debts \$42; on Conference moneys and benevolences, \$65, an advancement of over 30 per cent. over last year. The pastor, although sick for several weeks, has labored hard and the people love him and desire his return.

7. Crumpton, Rev. J. E. A. D. Grigsby, pastor, is serving very acceptably his second year. The smallpox prevented the holding of the annual campmeeting on this Circuit upon which this charge depends for a large proportion of its financial income. The charge embraces three churches and has a fine commodious parsonage. The pastor deserves much credit for the work accomplished. Conversions, \$10; raised for improvements, \$25; on old debts \$275; and the benevolences raised.

8. Delaware City and Kirkwood, Rev. E. O. Parker, pastor. This charge has had another year of remarkable financial success. The pastor has faithfully preached the Gospel and taught the people who love him. He is a bright and congenial young man. Raised on old debts, \$40, and the benevolences are all full and an advancement of 30 per cent. over last year.

9. Dover, Rev. J. H. Johnson, pastor. This is one of the strongest and best charges on the District and ranks first class, No. 1 on Missionary Roll. The church has been neatly repaired, remodeled and presents an attractive appearance. Raised on improvements, \$301; on old debts, \$37; on benevolences and Conference moneys, \$109. Rev.

J. H. Johnson is a good pastor and a successful worker. The Quarterly Conference ask for his return. He goes to the Conference leaving revival fire burning and sinners crying for salvation. Conversions 15.

10. Dover Circuit, Rev. D. R. Dunn, pastor. This charge has had another year of good success. Conversions, 3; raised on improvements, \$100; on old debts, \$20; benevolences reported, \$50, an advancement over last year. The pastor is a zealous Gospel preacher, the people love him and his return is asked for.

11. Galena, Rev. C. W. Moore, pastor. This charge suffered this winter from the epidemic of diphtheria, and for about two months the churches were closed greatly hindering the prosecution of church work. But the good people of this charge, loyal to God and the church, and with love for their pastor rallied to his calls, and as a result he reports 3 converts. Raised on improvements, \$56.18; on old debts, \$40, and the benevolences in advance of last year.

12. Maryland, Rev. G. T. Fields, pastor. This is one of the best Circuits on the District and reports another year of success. The pastor is an earnest Gospel preacher, a hard worker, and the charge has been blessed with a gracious revival, resulting in 62 conversions, 50 accessions, and the church greatly edified. Raised for improvements, \$61; on old debts, \$55; benevolences in advance of last year.

13. Middletown, Rev. J. R. Brown pastor. This is one of the best stations on the District with a very neat Church edifice. The pastor and people have labored harmoniously and faithfully and a good year's work has been accomplished. Conversions 17. Raised for improvements, \$84; on old debts, \$163. Benevolences raised in full—an advancement of 43 per cent. over last year. The pastor is a diligent student, an able preacher, and a good pastor. The people love him and ask for his return.

14. Millington: Rev. C. S. Sprigg pastor. Bro. Sprigg is a good preacher. This charge has raised this year \$80 for the purpose of rebuilding or remodelling the Church; on improvements, \$33; on Benevolences, \$42. The pastor and wife are faithful workers and deserve much credit.

15. New Castle: The appearance of small pox in the town and the closing up of a number of industries have greatly interfered with the success of the work. The pastor also had an attack of illness which lasted for several weeks. The conscientious and faithful pastor aided by his most excellent wife, and the good people of this church deserve great credit. Conversions 5. Raised on old debts and improvements, \$132. Benevolent collections in advance of last year.

16. Newport: Rev. A. J. Wallace pastor. The pastor and his wife have labored faithfully and deserve great credit. These people are loyal Methodists and the outlook for a strong church is favorable. Benevolent collections in advance of last year. The conference will much regret to learn that Bro. Wallace informs me that himself and wife are quarantined on account of small pox in next house, though none of his family is afflicted; and consequently he will not be able to attend this session of conference. He expects the quarantine to be raised on the 29th inst.

17. Odessa: Rev. J. C. Banton pastor. This charge has succeeded nicely under the wise and careful administration of Bro. Banton. Indebtedness reduced and improvements made and the Benevolent Collections taken. There has been a deepening of spirituality in the churches.

18. Port Deposit: Rev. S. E. Maloney pastor. This is a first class charge with a first class people and pastor. Rev. S. E. Maloney

has succeeded admirably on all lines especially is the work most commendable at Cokesbury where a mortgage indebtedness of many years standing was cancelled in four months. Converts 22. Raised on improvements, \$240; on old debts \$680. The pastor's salary has been increased \$100 over last year and Cokesbury paid the pastor \$30 over salary. Benevolent apportionments fully met. The people love Dr. Maloney and ask his return.

19. Sassafraz: Rev. I. H. Johnson pastor. This charge has succeeded very nicely this Conference year. Continuously rainy Sundays have hindered the work, but the pastor is hopeful. Two hundred and fifty dollars have been raised for building a new church at Warwick and there has been an advancement in Benevolent Collections.

20. St. Georges and Port Penn: This work is supplied by Bro. H. E. Dixon. He has done the best he could under the circumstances. Preparations are being made to build a new church at Port Penn. Something raised on Benevolences.

21. Townsend: Rev. J. K. Adams pastor. This is a good Circuit with four churches. Rev. J. K. Adams has been crowned with success this year. He comes to Conference with a good report. His Benevolences are in good shape. Conversions, 8.

22. Smyrna: Rev. W. J. L. Hughes pastor. For many years this charge has been struggling and in a critical condition. The people are loyal and heroic Methodists. Under the skillful leadership of the young pastor, Rev. W. J. L. Hughes, the congregation has been enlarged and united, the embarrassing indebtedness adjusted, and \$410 raised on the same, and the Benevolent Collection all in advance of last year. Bro. Hughes is an excellent young man, a good preacher, the people love him and desire his return.

23. Mt. Joy: Rev. H. T. Johnson pastor. This is one our best and strongest stations. It has had a long and hard struggle with a heavy indebtedness but the people are hopeful. Though there has been some misunderstanding, the pastor and people rejoice in another year of success. The indebtedness has been reduced and the Benevolent Collections taken.

24. Haven: Rev. R. G. Waters pastor. This is also one of the best stations on the District with some of the best people in Methodism. It is a growing Church. The pastor, Rev. R. G. Waters is an able and eloquent preacher and he and his good people rejoice in another year of success. Conversions, 10. Raised for improvements, \$175; on old debts, \$350. Benevolences in advance of last year.

25. Ezion: Dr. P. O'Connell pastor. This is the strongest and leading Church in the District and one of the best in the Conference. These people are good Methodists and love their Church. Dr. O'Connell is a scholarly and fluent preacher, a good pastor and he and his people rejoice over the year's success, with 3 converts, \$531 raised on improvements, and all the Benevolent apportionments amounting to \$441 raised in full, an advance over the previous year. The people love the pastor and earnestly desire his return believing him to be the right man in the right place.

With a heart overflowing with praise to God for his past blessings upon the work and workers and a firm reliance for the future upon the Great Head of the Church who said, "I am with you always." This my first annual report of the Wilmington District is most respectfully,

*Annual Minutes of the
Centreville District.*

Notwithstanding the unusual number of rainy Sundays and the more than three months of bad roads this district has had a prosperous year. The pastors have put forth strenuous efforts and made great sacrifice to overcome obstacles. They have snatched victory from the jaws of defeat. We believe that is what we are called for to do heroic service—to endure hardness as good soldiers of Jesus Christ. We come up with unbroken ranks. None of the pastors have fallen by death though several have suffered from sickness.

SPIRITUAL CONDITION.

Believing that the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth, most of the pastors have wrought with intense earnestness for the conversion of sinners and the edification of believers. Not even the disagreeable weather and bad roads have deterred them from accomplishing some glorious results through revival efforts.

We are thankful to report 597 professed conversions and 514 accessions.

There remains, however, much to be done to make our churches thoroughly spiritual. Class meetings can be made more effective by varying the exercises as the Discipline directs. Many of our classes have fallen into formality through the use of a uniform method. We must revive here and make our class meetings more helpful, more spiritual.

Faithful pastoral visiting from house to house, personal contact with people pressing home upon them the need of present salvation, as well as fervent preaching, is still necessary, if we would fulfill our high calling to glorify God by the saving the greatest possible number of souls.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S SOCIETIES.

There has been some revival in Epworth League work. The annual District Epworth Convention was held in Easton, Md., June 28th, 1902 and proved an inspiration to the Local Chapters. Although it is difficult to maintain the League in the country charges, several pastors on this district have succeeded.

Junior Leagues or classes for religious instruction have been formed on nearly every charge. Some faithful training of the children for Christ has been done. We regret there are so many parents among us who do not co-operate with the pastors by sending their children for this need instruction.

We have held this year two Sunday School Conventions in the bounds of the district. Except where hindered by disagreeable weather, our schools show progress.

EDUCATION.

A somewhat increased interest is being taken in securing students for our schools and in promoting the cause of education. Most of the pastors have complied with the requirement of the Discipline and have preached or caused to be preached the sermon on education, and have taken the collection and made the canvass for students. Some did not. All observed Children's Day.

Beyond controversy, we have made progress in education but our people are still a long way behind. It behooves every pastor to be faithful. The people need to know more about the advantages of Morgan College and its branch Princess Anne Academy that are at our door. They need to be aroused to embrace these opportunities, that

their "sons may be as plants grown up in their youth," that their "daughters may be as cornerstones, polished after the similitude of a palace." Let students go to these schools from every charge.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

There has been some growth in sentiment against Sabbath desertion. Customs have grown around camp meetings that are detrimental to the spirituality of the churches. That God's law for a rest day is opposed by most people, that even some church members affect to see no need of its strict observance, ought not to deter us from keeping the Sabbath unto the Lord when we remember the "carnal mind is enmity against God."

The out door summer meetings have been profitable in several places where they have not been mere catch penny affairs. We have waged for six years unrelenting war against churches holding Sunday picnics with preaching service attached. We believe the end does not justify the means unless the means be right. Our standard is the Word of God. It is not Methodistic to compromise with sin or play expediency over against duty. It is unchristian to seek ease, profit or pleasure at the sacrifice of the glory of God. "Not every one that saith unto me Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven" declared the Master.

BENEVOLENT COLLECTION.

For the sixth successive time I am able to report this district passes the one million and a half line with every appointment in class first. The aggregate amount is the largest in the history of the district. All of the other benevolent collections have been looked after and the grand total for all benevolent and conference collections go beyond the high water mark of last year.

SUMMARY OF THE WORK.

Carmichael Circuit with G. T. Townsend, pastor, has paid \$208 on old indebtedness and raised in full all apportionments. This charge is in good condition.

Centreville has renovated and enlarged the parsonage paying \$230 on the same beside \$130 on old indebtedness. The pastor's salary has been increased and all claims have been fully met. Here faithful and systematic work has been done. 27 accessions. F. H. Butler, pastor.

Centreville Circuit with C. A. Norwood, pastor, has made her best record in raising the benevolent collections, paid in full all ministerial support and has reduced the standing debt.

Chestertown charge has succeeded in spite of opposition from within and from without. The change of pastor last year was the occasion of some dissatisfaction but the wisdom of Bishop Merrill's appointment has been demonstrated by the results obtained. \$212 has been paid on old indebtedness and all apportionments have been raised in full. The spiritual outlook is brighter than for several years. Heroic work has been done. W. E. Waters, pastor.

Church Hill Circuit with L. H. Martin, pastor, has done a fair year's work. \$120 has been paid on old indebtedness.

Coleman charge has bought a good six room parsonage admirably situated and raised and paid \$443 on it beside \$55 on account of furniture. With increased support for the pastor all claims have been fully met. W. A. Hubbard, pastor.

Denton with T. A. Johnson, pastor has had a year of marked success. \$169 paid on old indebtedness, and 44 conversions and acces-

tions are reported. The ministerial support according to apportionment has been raised and the benevolent collections are greatly in advance of last year.

Easton has renovated and beautified the exterior of both church and parsonage at the cost of \$500 and paid \$400 on the same, raised all apportionments and has had 103 professed conversions and 89 accessions. Every department of this church is alive. A. L. Henry, pastor.

Fairlee with J. R. Brinkley, pastor, has repaired, renovated and re-furnished the parsonage and paid for the same at the cost \$374. All other interest have been faithful looked after.

Greensboro has paid off a church extension debt of long standing and has started a fund for a new church which is greatly needed. This charge has been ably managed and all the apportionments have been raised in full. R. H. Coleman, pastor.

Kent Island with J. H. Winters, pastor, reports benevolent collections in advance of last year. The pastor has worked hard.

Ridgely Circuit has done a great year's work. The new church at Ridgely completed last year has been dedicated and \$600 has been paid on old indebtedness. 76 conversions and 68 accessions are reported. J. W. Jefferson, pastor.

Royal Oak charge with Abraham Chase, pastor, reports \$322 paid on old indebtedness, 28 conversions and 23 accessions. This circuit is making steady advancement.

St. Michaels has paid \$512 on their standing debt besides keeping up current expenses and raising ministerial support and the benevolent collections. This is a strong church with a strong leader. R. G. Riley, pastor.

Skipton with P. T. Scott, pastor, has done a fair year's work. 23 conversions and 15 accessions.

What was formerly Williamsburg A. U. M. P. Church located in the centre of a large settlement of colored people has been received

into our Church. They have 38 members and property worth about \$400. They have been incorporated according to the laws of Maryland as a Methodist Episcopal Church and the property has been deeded according to the Discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the laws of the state. The pastor desires the recognition of his orders and to be given work.

We raised this year for building and improving property \$2480 and for old indebtedness \$3122 and for all benevolent and conference collections \$2187.

This district owns a good parsonage of nine rooms located at Centreville, Md., as the residence of the Presiding Elder. My predecessor Rev. L. Y. Cox began this enterprise raising a third of its cost. During my term the balance has been raised and paid amounting in principal and interest so \$1059.

Philadelphia District.

The territory of the Philadelphia District of the Delaware Conference includes the territory embraced in the bounds of the Southern portion of the Philadelphia Conference, all of New Jersey, Newark, New York and New York East Conferences. A forward movement is absolutely necessary along this line.

cept general croakers. Every branch of the church work looked after. Raised for building and improvements \$344. Benevolences full.

Mt. Holly—The pastor has worked very hard against adverse circumstances with little success. Raised on old indebtedness and improvements \$165. Benevolences looked after.

W Phila., John Wesley—A very much better year's work than last. \$200 raised for the building fund. They are in quest of a suitable place to build a church, \$500 now in hand. Hundreds of people in this neighborhood are without a church home. We hope to be able to find a site soon. A few conversions. Benevolences in advance of last year.

Frankford—The pastor here is finishing up his seventh year. They think they can stand him another year and so have requested his return. He exemplifies good things some times come in large bundles. \$1450 raised on old indebtedness. Five conversions. Benevolences full.

Orange—The pastor made a strenuous effort to cancel the indebtedness. Through a miscarriage his plans failed, notwithstanding a most excellent year's work has been done. \$305 raised on improvements and old indebtedness. Seven conversions. Benevolences prodded for.

Phila., Haven—The pastor here had a long and tedious attack of the rheumatic fever. For a number of weeks his life was despaired of. This came right in the midst of an effort to cancel the mortgage debt on the church, and nearly paralyzed the work. For improvements and old indebtedness \$885. A gracious revival swept over this charge, twenty-one conversions. Benevolences full. The people happy and want the pastor returned for his sixth year even if he does get married.

Atlantic City—The best financial year in the history of the church. The tangled finances have been straightened so that there will be plain sailing for the future. \$450 paid on old indebtedness. Seven conversions. Benevolences full.

Grenloch—This church has been thoroughly renovated. Everything is in good shape. \$170 raised for improvements. Benevolences provided for.

Bainbridge St.—A great many doubted the wisdom of Brother Tindley's leaving the Presiding Eldership to take this Pastorate, but his course has been fully justified in the results obtained. The church has been remodeled so as to furnish a seating capacity for 1200 at a cost of \$15000. They are yet crowded for room. The pastor says he is going to keep on back to the next block. These people are the happiest in Philadelphia. \$5319 raised on improvements and old indebtedness. All benevolent collections full.

Bridgeton Circuit—We have moved the congregation from North to South Bridgeton because it was too close to the A. M. E. Church. A wealthy layman is paying the rent and promises to help in securing a much needed church on a good site. When this is done Methodism will greatly advance in this growing city. Benevolence advanced. Good foundation laid for another year.

Magnolia—A much needed church edifice is under construction. Notwithstanding it was almost an absolute necessity perfect harmony could not be secured when they commenced the building. \$820 raised for new church. Something collected on benevolences.

Phila., Zoar—This charge has done a fair year's work under adverse conditions. There is still room for harmony. Without harmony it is impossible for any church large or small to do it's best work. Raised for improvements and old indebtedness \$763. Some conversions. Benevolences in advance of last year.

Rutherford, N. J.—Brother Gales, who was received on probation last year, from this place, promising to deed the property to the Methodist Episcopal Church, readily discovered that you put the fence too high so went to the A. M. E. Zion Church hoping to find a more congenial pasture.

Salem Circuit—This charge is struggling against great odds. Large numbers of the people are moving. This makes hard pulling for those who stay. The pastor has worked hard to make things go with some success. Benevolences looked after.

Camden—A very good year's work. A much needed parsonage has been secured, which materially reduces the current expenses. Raised on old indebtedness \$400. Benevolences provided for.

Brooklyn—This work came to us last year through the reajustment of work in and around New York. This congregation occupies a frame building on the corner of Hecktmer and Schnecktady Avenue. A fine location. Lot 100x103. Cost ten thousand dollars. We are very anxious to secure this property. They have a very fine Sunday School. A fair work has been done conditions being considered.

The Brethren of the district have worked very hard to make success on all lines, but it seems as if the very heavens have fought against us. There have been about 27 rainy Sundays out of the fifty in the conference year. Notwithstanding there have been more than \$17,000 raised for old indebtedness and improvements. You will observe that the present indebtedness is increased, but the conditions of the work on the Philadelphia District will necessarily increase that indebtedness for some time yet. We would have you keep in mind that amounts raised for improvements and old indebtedness are increased correspondingly. Our present indebtedness is \$50,883.

We are praying that the Baptismal Fire may spread over the whole work and thousands may be saved.

MISSIONS.

Our Mission work is moving on fairly well considering the conditions under which it is prosecuted. The church at Ocean City, N. J., was finished last summer. Cost \$3200. For the present services are conducted here only during the summer season. The attendance was large all of last season. Something over four hundred dollars was contributed towards the building fund and the expenses of the church kept up. There is a debt of \$1500. \$1000 secured by first mortgage.

We thank all of the friends throughout the bounds of the conference who made the donation of twelve hundred dollars possible. Generations yet unborn will praise them for their beneficence. The same manifested good, another season, will put this much needed church on a permanent basis.

The Mission Summerville has done well. A deed has been secured for a lot and we hope to build soon. Thirty two members. Forty two in Sunday School.

The mission in North Camden gives some promise of success. Quite a revival during the year, eleven converts. It is earnestly hoped that a church may be put here.

There is an earnest effort on the district to strengthen all of our agencies. The Education Work is being thoroughly organized, every appointment is put in touch with our schools. Nothing short of one student from each charge in Morgan College, or its' branches, will begin to satisfy our most ardent desire.

Consecrated, educated young women and men are the absolute necessity for the saving of our people. To see the thousands that are pouring into the large cities would make your heart tremble. What

agencies are to save these untutored, unchurched masses that are coming into our midst, in too many instances, homeless, aimless and unprotected? Who will do the work?

Take Philadelphia and New York. A recent statistician tells us that there are seventy thousand Colored People in Philadelphia, forty seven churches with a seating capacity of twenty thousand. Fifty thousand practically excluded from church services. The church does not influence them? What influence will take its place? In New York there are sixty thousand, church provisions no better than Philadelphia

One of the best Criminal Lawyers, in Philadelphia, says that about 25 per cent. of our girls coming from good country homes, many of the graduates of Normal, High School and Seminaries, go down into the maelstroms of vice. No race can long stand such a tearful drainage of its best blood. I am not a pessimist and beg that you will not consider me weak, but the situation makes me tremble.

Are not the leaders of the Methodist Episcopal Church consoling themselves upon the idea that the Methodist Churches, distinctively Colored, will take care of our people in the North, while they direct all of their energies toward correcting evils in the South Land? The leaders of the various branches of Colored Methodism confess their inability to cope with the conditions. They say so far as Methodists are concerned, if the work is done at all, the Methodist Church must do it. The disintegrated condition of the Baptist Church gives little hope of a permanent uplift.

Our forcee need strengthening. There ought to be a Deaconess' Home in Philadelphia, from which would go consecrated and educated women workers for the Lord. There ought to be a Domestic Training School for girls. In this age of the telegraph and telephone when the electric spark is harnessed to drive our riding vehicles, will those who hire help patiently wait for the girl to learn? They must learn before securing employment. The Women's Home Missionary Society will do that work. Organize your women.

The Philadelphia District spreads over entirely too much ground for the most efficient work. Allow me to suggest that if a Missionary District could be formed, embracing the churches in the upper part of New Jersey, New York and Conn., it would greatly add to the efficiency of our work; and would go a long way toward solving the problem of Church Relation. Four or five thousand dollars Missions needed for a few years would be a paying investment for time and eternity.

Brethren allow me to reassure you that your many kind and substantial remembrances will never be forgotten. My earnest prayer is that you may be graciously sustained. Your prayers and untiring solicitude for me during the time of my continued vacation made necessary from overwork will be always highly appreciated. May the blessings of the Lord ever preserve you and yours

Salisbury District.

It is with profound gratitude to Almighty God that I submit this my fourth annual report of the work of the Salisbury District. One year ago we received our appointments from Bishop Merrill, went forth not all weeping, but some weeping and some rejoicing, but all bearing precious seed, and now we come again bringing in our sheaves.

The Lord has most wonderfully blessed us this year. None of the pastors have died, some have been sick, but out of all the Lord has

brought us here to the seat of the Conference without the loss of one. Grim death invaded the home of Bro. Ridout and took from his embrace and that of four dear little children that loving wife and mother. Sister Ridout was a model woman. Bro. J. C. Dunn will read a suitable memoir of her life. No where on earth can there be found a more loyal and self-sacrificing band of preachers than these on the Salisbury District. We believe every man has done his best. We have a live monthly Preachers' meeting, it is indeed a source of great helpfulness to all of the brethren and they realize it from the way they attend. They come through hot and cold to be together once a month. On the tenth of this month we had the largest meeting of the year; this was a great help to the Presiding Elder as I was able to get the reports together. Besides this, Mr. President, these noble set of men made the heart of the Presiding Elder glad. At this meeting they presented me with a handsome purse of about twenty-five dollars as a token of their appreciation. I am happy to say that there is the tenderest brotherly feeling between pastors and Presiding Elder.

REVIVALS.

While we have not had a general outpouring as we had last, I rejoice that we have had good revivals in some parts and there has been added to the church many whom we trust shall be eternally saved. Our churches are spiritually alive. It is worthy of special mention that sinners have been converted both at the preaching and the Communion services; this is as it should be. An appeal should be made to sinners at all of the services; if more of this was done I believe that God would add daily to the church such as He would delight in saving. "We are preaching, praying and laboring for the salvation of the world, and our chief song is "Nearer My God to Thee."

Some good work has been accomplished for the temperance cause this year in Wicomico county. We had the privilege of voting the saloon out of Salisbury last November, also out of Nutters District; this will make this county a local option one, like Somerset county, with the exception of one or two small districts. I understand Worcester county is becoming aroused, and it only seems a question of time when there will not be a saloon in any of the Maryland counties south of Delmar—God haste the day.

BENEVOLENT COLLECTION.

Last year the Salisbury District raised the largest Missionary Collection ever raised by any district in the history of the Conference. This year we started out to beat ourselves, and notwithstanding the seventeen or eighteen rainy Sundays, we have succeeded, this year our Missionary collection to the parent Board will reach nearly eleven hundred dollars, and many of the other collections in advance of last year.

We have raised for building and improvements five thousand two hundred and eighty-six dollars, and about four thousand dollars on old debts, thus you will see our pastors are well trained, and our people contribute liberally.

MEMBERSHIP.

This District has five thousand seven hundred and twelve full members, an increase over last year of two hundred and sixty-two; number of probationers, eight hundred and twenty-five; Converts reported, seven hundred and eighty-one, and number of accessions, seven hundred and thirty-three.

OUR YOUNG PEOPLE.

I have tried to keep constantly before us the great responsibility

of the church to our young people; as a result, I believe more interest is manifested in this direction than ever before.

We have thirty-one classes of children formed for religious instruction, and some good work is being accomplished along this important line.

We have also thirty-two Epworth Leagues, with a membership of eleven hundred and eighty-four. Our Annual Convention held at Unionville last June was a decided success.

EDUCATION.

Prof. Frank Trigg has had charge of the Princess Anne Academy this year, and the work has been simply phenomenal. Many improvements have been made in the way of buildings and equipments; a large stock barn, a pigery and henery have been erected, all of the building have been thoroughly renovated.

The largest number of students—one hundred and fifty—have been enrolled than during any year in the history of the institution.

Prof. Trigg is a man of long experience in educational work, having been for sixteen years principal of a school of nineteen teachers, and being a fellow student of Booker T. Washington, at the rate of progress made in one year it will not be long before we will have a second Tuskegee. The academy has a faculty of twelve teachers and instructors. The following departments are organized and equipped for the boys: Blacksmithing, wheelwright, Carpentry, Joinery, Architecture, Painting. The department of Agriculture has been thoroughly equipped, and new stock and improved implements are in hand and they have an expert instructor.

It is impossible for me to write in full of this work. Prof. Trigg will give us a full account of his work and its needs. One thing more however should be mentioned, and that is this—for the girls facilities have been provided for teaching them the various branches of domestic science, such as Cutting, Sewing, Darning, Mending, Light-house-keeping and Laundering. In all these departments substantial progress has been made.

APPOINTMENTS.

Cottage Grove—J. W. Waters the pastor has done a splendid year's work; every dollar of the benevolences raised in full. Converts, 81; Received on probation, 84; Raised on old indebtedness, \$420 and for repairs on parsonage, \$85.

Deal's Island—L. W. Deakins the pastor has been very successful, the parsonage has been remodeled, four new rooms 12 by 24 have been added at a cost of \$350. Bro. Deakins has never come up short in his benevolences.

Dames Quarter—R. H. Boggs the pastor has worked hard and deserves great credit. The church at Dames Quarter has been remodeled by placing a large recess pulpit in and the church at Rock Creek has been thoroughly renovated, frescoed and painted outside and in, all paid for except about \$32. Forty seven converts are reported and collection good.

Exmore—Samuel Coffman the pastor has accomplished a grand work. The church at Exmore has been neatly painted, papered, carpeted, fenced in, they have also purchased a bell. Converts, sixteen, and all collections full.

Fairmount—J. F. Molock the pastor brings a splendid report. The parsonage has been nicely papered and newly furnished. The benevolences are up. Converts ten.

Fruitland—J. R. Holland has done a phenomenal year's work. Twenty converts are reported. Every dollar of benevolences collected early in the Conference year. The new church at Fruitland has been completed. The parsonage has been remodeled by adding a new front. Total raised for improvements about \$1,000.

Hopewell—S. W. Waters, the pastor, is closing the best of three years at this place; for the last three weeks one of the churches has been in the midst of a glorious revival, eighteen converts are reported and every dollar of the benevolent collections are raised in full.

Jamestown—W. H. Johnson, the pastor, who was reported last year as having been feeble in health has fully recovered, and has done a good year's work, reporting twenty-two converts, benevolent collections good; about seventy-five dollars spent for improvements.

Leemont—E. D. Hovens. The pastor comes with the best report perhaps ever made from this charge, reporting thirty-eight converts. Benevolent collections up. The church beautifully ceiled and thoroughly renovated. A large bell and magnificent chandeliers have been placed in, and a Sunday School library has been purchased.

Marion Station—I. H. White, the pastor, reports a splendid year's work. The benevolent collections in full with eight accessions. The new church 32 by 50, lecture room 18 by 30, with rear projection 8 by 30 will be when completed one of our best churches. The building is enclosed. The amount raised for this work \$1481.

Marion Circuit—Hodson Waters, the young man who will come up for admission this year, in charge of this work, reports eighteen converts, with every dollar of collections in full. A house and lot has been purchased for a parsonage, amount raised on the same about \$150.

Oak Hall, T. B. H. Coleman, pastor. A good work has been done, seven accessions; the collections good. One hundred dollars expended on improvements in and around the parsonage.

Oriole, C. E. Henry, pastor. The reports from this charge stands among the best. The benevolent collections full, eight converts and one hundred and forty-four dollars raised on old debts.

Parsonsburg, Emory Nichols, pastor. Reports twenty-two accessions, one hundred and sixteen dollars raised for improvements, with the benevolent collections taken.

Puncheon Landing—E. E. Rodgers. The pastor reports one church repaired; ten converts, and benevolent collections nearly all full.

Snow Hill Circuit—S. F. Ward, the pastor, has done the hardest work with less pay than any one on the district and deserves much credit. He reports eleven converts, the collections good. The trustees at Queponco have bought a church formerly owned by the white people at Newark, and partially paid for the same.

Union—L. J. Waters, the pastor, has served the one little church near Princess Anne creditably. Reports six converts, collections full, and twenty dollars raised for improvements. He is a candidate for admission.

Unionville—J. W. Fenderson, the pastor, notwithstanding he has been afflicted, has done a most gratifying year's work, reporting twelve converts, benevolences all taken in full. A parsonage built upon modern style has been completed at a cost of four hundred and eighty-five dollars, with only two hundred dollars remaining against the property. This reflects credit upon both pastor and people.

Wattsville, J. S. Coulbourn, pastor. This has been a year of prosperity, fifty-two converts are reported. The benevolent collections all full. The parsonage has been repaired and a room added as pas-

tor's study; amount raised for this work and on old debts over three hundred and forty dollars.

Wetipquin—W. H. Hayman, the pastor, reports fifty accessions. Every dollar of the collections raised. They have purchased a lot for a cemetery, and the lumber is on the ground to build a new church at Wetipquin.

White Haven—J. C. Dunn, the pastor, has done a remarkable year's work. Had he not been a skillful manager of men, this work would have gone to pieces, his predecessor has been there all the year and of course this did not contribute any thing to the success of the incumbent, but he comes to the Conference with all of the collections in full, six accessions, and have raised for improvements and on old debts two hundred and sixty-four dollars. This I say is remarkable.

Crisfield, J. H. Harman, pastor. This year has been one of unprecedented success. The report is as follows: Converts, ninety; Accessions, ninety-two. All benevolent collections full. Asbury Church remodeled at a cost of one thousand and fifty dollars; four hundred and fifty raised on the same. Shilo Church, (brick) was in such bad condition as to render it unsafe so it was taken down; plans are laid for a new church, with the greater part of material on the ground. For this work three hundred and fifty dollars have been raised. Total amount raised for improvements \$1345.

Pocomoke City, J. H. B. Hubbard, pastor. I need not say much for this charge since you are here and see for yourselves. The report is a most excellent one. Ten converts and fourteen accessions are reported. The benevolent collections are raised. The parsonage has been painted and thoroughly renovated. When we consider what a hard struggle these people have had, on account of the indebtedness on the church, I repeat, the report is an excellent one.

Stockton—J. W. Cook, pastor, is closing the best of three years. Every thing full; Sixty converts; eighty-eight dollars raised for improvements and one hundred and eighty-nine on old debts.

Nanticoke, D. A. Ridout, pastor. This charge has had a pleasant and prosperous year; there have been thirty-two accessions, the benevolent collections all taken in full, and two hundred and twenty dollars raised on old debts.

Salisbury, J. E. A. Johns, pastor. The church which was remodeled last year has been completed, the ceiling and walls are beautifully painted and the pews and furniture is of Oak finish. Three hundred and seventy-six dollars have been expended, and three hundred and seventy-five paid on old debts; sixteen accession; the collections are more than full, and the charge is in a good condition in every particular.

Salisbury Circuit—B. W. Berry, the pastor, reports three converts and the same number of accessions. Collections up to the apportionments. A new church is in course of erection 30 by 50 feet with lecture room on side. Three hundred dollars have been expended on this church. The pastor has also organized a Sunday School at Hebron, a new and thrifty town about eight miles west of Salisbury. Plans are also laid to build a church at this place.

Widgeon—J. E. Cook, the pastor, brings the best report that this charge has made for a number of years, as a result of a great revival. These dry bones are beginning to live and move; there have been eighty-one converts and seventy-eight accessions. The benevolent collections are nearly full. Thirty dollars raised for improvements and one hundred and fifty dollars on old debts.

Fair Oaks, J. W. Bowling, pastor. This brother makes the best report of his life; ten converts; twelve accessions; a parsonage has

been bought; sixty dollars raised for improvements and forty-five dollars on old debts.

Snow Hill, M. L. McKenny, pastor. Owing to smallpox, which closed the church for more than six weeks, this charge has had a hard struggle, yet the reports are far better than we expected. There have been thirty-six conversions and thirty-three accessions. The benevolent collection are about full and about three hundred dollars raised on old debts.

Princess Anne, M. H. Horsey, pastor. No charge has had more discouragements than this one, yet they have done well. A terrible storm carried away the steeple of the church, breaking into the roof of the church and incurring quite an expense, this together with the debt on the church, made it very hard for them, they have however, succeeded in lifting the mortgage from the Church Extension; spent for improvements seventy-five dollars, and raised on old debts two hundred dollars. The benevolences are nearly full.

Quantico, J. A. Jeffers, pastor. This has been a good year for this charge. The old debt which has long been hanging over the church has been paid. The benevolent collections all raised and quite a number of improvements made around the parsonage.

In concluding my report I would say that we are thankful to God for the many blessing bestowed upon us, and the glorious privilege of laboring in the greatest work committed to the care of man.

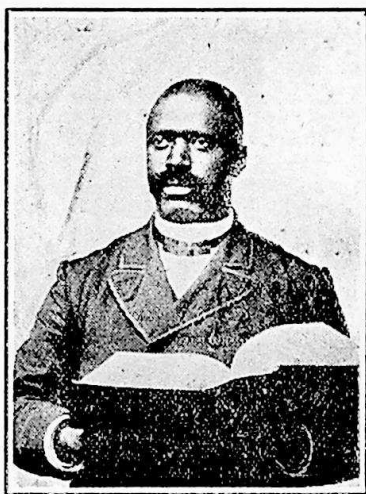

Memoirs.

ISAAC JAMES ELBERT.

The subject of this sketch, the son of the late Joseph D. Elbert, was born at Morgnec, Kent County, Maryland, Sept. 23, 1858 and departed this life April 23, 1902, at Germantown, Pa., aged 42 years and 7 months. He left a widowed mother and wife to mourn their loss. Brother Elbert was a man of deep piety and religious fervor. His brethren would have as soon trusted to his integrity as any living man. He was a big hearted man, cool and collected. There was an air about him which made one feel that he was truly in the presence of a man of God. He was regarded by his brethren as a model of modesty.

He was converted at Dover, Delaware at the age of seventeen, an experience which he delighted to relate. We all remember how he used to say, "I know that I have passed from death unto life, because I have love in my heart. God's spirit bears witness with my spirit that I am a child of God." His confidence in God was never shaken.

He was educated in the Public Schools of Maryland, The Centenary Biblical Institute, and Howard University. He completed his Theological Course at Howard University in 1890 and supplied Coleman Charge of the Centreville District that year. The next year he joined the Delaware Conference at Cambridge, Maryland. He served the following Charges: Coleman, Maryland, two years, Greensbor-

ough three years, Unionville two years, Marion three years, and Middletown, Delaware two years. He was an earnest Gospel preacher. His highest aspiration was to become a powerful and spiritual preacher of God's word. He loved the Bible and filled his sermons with the old doctrines of repentance, regeneration and sanctification. He was successful in revivals.

He united in marriage with Miss Clara H. Thomas at Union A. M. E. Church, Philadelphia, Pa., July 20, 1892. This was a happy union. They lived together as little children. She was a companion in every way and delighted to make his work her work. He delighted to tell us about his "Elbert" as he used to call her.

He was taken from us in the prime of life, suddenly snatched from the ranks of the army whose colors he bore. He went from the thralldom of conquest with suffering wounds fighting to become a prince among the redeemed host.

The funeral obsequies were held in Janes M. E. Church, Germantown, Pa., April 25, 1902, conducted by Rev. A. R. Shockley, Presiding Elder of the Philadelphia District. Remarks were made by Bros. N. W. Moore, C. W. Pullett, C. A. Tindley, and W. F. Cotton. Interment was in Asbury Cemetery Easton, Maryland, by the side of his departed father, there to await the resurrection of the Just.

It was while in service of this charge that he was wedded to his much beloved and devoted wife, Miss Harmon, Dec. 24, 1900.

His devotion to his family was unswerved and true.

He leaves a wife and one child, upon whom we ask God's divine blessing and continued guidance.

Just before he died he expressed his anxiety of a reunion with his family in the land of endless day and uninterpreted bliss; and exhorted his unsaved brother, to join the army of the Lord.

As life's tide was ebbing he sang, "The Lord loves the cheerful giver." And as he was ushered down to the Jordan he sang, "Death where is thy sting," and as he went down deeper he cried, "Grave where is thy victory." He has answered the summons from above and now with the just made perfect he roams the hills of immortality.

Report of Conference Visitors to Morgan College.

On Thursday, March 12th, we visited Morgan College. We were cordially welcomed by Prof. C. E. Young, A. M., Dean of the College, and he conducted us to all parts of the building, and each teacher cordially greeted us and kept on with recitation.

CLASS ROOM WORK.

The work being done in the classes seemed to us most thorough. Of course we were not Greek and Latin scholars, but the fluent manner in which Cæsar, Virgil, and Xenophon were being read, and the promptness with which verbs and difficult constructions were disposed of, refreshed our minds, recalled to memory the days when we labored with Cæsar's syntax and the Greek verb. We were deeply impressed that pains-taking and conscientious work was being accomplished in the Classics. We feel free to say that the recitations in English would satisfy any competent and fair minded person. We were privileged to hear a part of the recitations in Psychology, English Grammar and History. The teachers are competent and patient. The enthusiasm which is so necessary in acquiring an education was shown among the students. Not an enthusiasm for cramming but an enthusiasm for power to grasp a principle and the knowledge to apply it.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY.

The College Library is an excellent collection of books and magazines. There are more than 4500 volumes stowed upon the shelves. The student hungering and thirsting for knowledge may find, upon these shelves, information and instruction upon almost any subject, for which he is seeking. The Library room is large, well lighted and well ventilated.

IMPROVEMENTS.

The building has been renovated and some needed improvements added. The President's Office has been repaired and the walls beautifully decorated and the room tastefully furnished. The Dean takes comfort in thinking it the equal of any College President's Office in the State of Maryland.

A long felt need of the School has been met under the Presidency of Rev. J. O. Spencer, Ph. D., viz, a resident apartment has been arranged in the building for girls. Two large rooms have been fitted up with booths on one side and single bedsteads on the other. The booths are furnished with mirror, wash-bowl and pitcher, metal stand and rug and curtains. The girls are under the direct supervision of Mrs. C. E. Young, the Dean's wife. Parents may now feel that their girls are as safe at Morgan College as at home.

Another improvement is, the Dean lives in the College building. Three rooms are well furnished and he and his wife have a comfortable home. Prof. Young looks after the boys and sees that the rules are kept. He reports that students are industrious and obedient; that the characteristics of a Christian home are evident in the dormitory life of the institution; that at present, 80 students are in attendance, a larger number than for some years past, but that more boys and girls can easily be accommodated. Neatness and cleanliness are marked distinctions throughout the whole building.

THE NEEDS OF THE COLLEGE.

1. The first need is the loyal support of the Alumni and students. One of the most hurtful things that can come to any school is dissatisfaction among and unmerciful criticism coming from its Alumni and students. If Morgan College is to live and grow, the Alumni and students must give it their loyal support.

2. It needs the unstinted co-operation of pastors. No Church school can have success independent of the pastors. We believe it to be the duty of every pastor to lay Morgan College, its supreme mission as a light of intelligence for the race, upon the hearts of the people.

Committee on Education.

To the President and Members of the Delaware Conference:— Since to us has been committed, in a large measure, the spiritual interests of all the colored people in our Conference territory, we deem it wise to emphasize the need of the best possible preparation on the part of those who aspire to a place in the ministry of our church. We would remind our young people that the time has gone when positions of honor and influence or lives of great usefulness may be hoed for, save by those who are willing to pay the price of careful and thorough training. We rejoice in the large-hearted liberality of the church in the establishment and maintenance of such institutions as the Boston School of Theology, Drew and Gammon Theological Seminaries, where opportunity is given to even the poorest and humblest to secure the benefits of the most modern idea of Biblical scholarship and instruction in the preparation and delivery of sermons, sound in doctrine and aglow with life.

In Morgan College we have an institution of which we may be justly proud, because of her excellent record in the past, her present attainment and future promise. She has exerted a potent influence on our Conference in the training of some of its strongest and brightest men. It is desirable that others of our young people besides those anticipating the ministry as a life work be influenced to attend Morgan College, as experience has shown such course of high utility, whatever profession or business was afterwards pursued. Graduates from Morgan take high rank.

Of secondary schools there are three in our Conference territory devoted to our race exclusively. The Ironsides Industrial School at Bordentown, N. J ; State College for Colored Students, at Dover, Del., and the Princess Anne Academy, at Princess Anne, Md. While each of these schools is doing a good work, with a constantly widening sphere of influence, none of them is what it should be either in equipment or attendance. The states of New Jersey and Delaware have each made generous appropriations for the benefit of their state schools and we trust that Maryland will soon give the Princess Anne

Academy a yearly appropriation. Since the latter is our own church school, our preachers are its natural and proper agents, whose efforts should be unremitting to fill its walls with the children from our Methodist homes. They should suggest, advise, exhort, insist till this institution is attended as the labors of its founders deserve and as the needs of our race demand it should be.

Short terms, poorly paid teachers and inadequate buildings are among the hindrances to good work in the public schools of the Delaware-Maryland peninsula, where most of our work is situated. This is a result and a cause of an alarming indifference to educational matters among our people. We believe it is not enough for the preachers to call attention to these evils, but they should, by personal effort and influence, strive to remedy them by

1. Securing as large a division of the school funds as possible to each District.

2. Insisting upon rigid economy in the administration of the funds with a view to lengthening the school year.

3. Urging the boys and girls at home to quality for teachers. Imported articles are usually more expensive.

4. Showing such appreciation for the service rendered by a good teacher as will compensate, in some measure, for sacrifices.

Creating sentiment in favor of comfort, convenience and attractiveness in the school property.

These are some of the ways in which the wise pastor may help the schools in the community where he labors. He will also teach the value of skilled labor, and force the attention of the young people to the importance of a trade, in repressing the evil and developing the good qualities of mind and heart.

We deplore the existence of a large and growing class of ignorant and idle youth. From the ranks of these are recruited the criminal and dissolute for whose offences we all must suffer. Upon the preachers as upon none others is laid the task of stemming the tide of this downward tendency and changing temporary and partial failure and defeat into complete victory.

Report of Freedmen's Aid Committee.

We are pleased to inform the Conference that under President Spencer and Prof. Trigg, Morgan College and Princess Anne Academy have experienced a regeneration. The change at the Academy is nothing less than wonderful. The trustees are spending from \$8,000 to \$10,000 in renovating the old buildings, erecting a plant for the thorough teaching of scientific agriculture, in purchasing thoroughbred stock, farming tools and implements and in equipping the shops with all the necessary tools and appliances. Now for the first time in the history of the school scientific farming is taught, and this department and all the other industries are in the hands of trained instructors. With the enlargement of facilities came an increase in attendance. The present enrollment—150—is 42 more than the highest ever reached heretofore. But the trustees will not be satisfied nor will our duty to our people and the State be done till the attendance reaches more than 500. Prof. Trigg is capable and enthusiastic. He is planning to make the Academy in all essentials a Tuskegee.

While the trustees have been building the Academy, they have not neglected the noble, dignified, strong mother, Morgan College.

The equipment for teaching the sciences and mathematics have been greatly increased. But the best thing done there was the alteration of the building so that the girls can live in the college. Mothers can send their daughters and feel sure that they are in a healthful, comfortably furnished christian home, presided over by true and tried friends, Dean Young and wife. President Spencer is universally praised for his wisdom, kindness and zeal. We rejoice in his coming among us and promise him our hearty support. In view of these great improvements made by the trustees, and in view of the energy and devotion of President Spencer and Principal Trigg the committee would respectfully urge the brethren to press the cause of education upon the attention of their people that they may pray for and give and send students to our schools.

Our apportionment for this cause is \$1800. We raised \$1017 last year, and this is \$36 less than we raised the year before. The simple and feasible suggestion of Dr. Spencer that we ask each one of our members to give a prayer a day and one cent a week for our schools, would raise more than our apportionment, if the pastors would lay it upon the hearts of their people. The general committee of the Freedmen's Aid Society urgently requests that the Lincoln birthday anniversary be observed in all our churches in the interest of patriotism and christian education as represented in the work of this Society, which stands for the intellectual and spiritual uplifting of every seventh man, woman and child in the Republic. The observance of the day is most appropriate as Lincoln gave emancipation to the four million slaves who have now become nine million freemen.

Resolved, Fourth, That the said committee shall pay over all money collected for Minute Publication Fund, to the Conference Secretary before the adjournment of the Conference, taking his receipt for the same.

NUMBER OF COPIES OF MINUTES.

Resolved, Fifth, That 3,000 copies of the Conference Minutes be printed and that the Secretary be the committee on publishing the same, and the minutes be sold at 15 cents per copy.

Resolved, That the expense of printing the reports of missionary contributions from charges be paid out of the missionary collection by the Treasurer.

DELINQUENT MINUTE ACCOUNTS.

Resolved, Sixth, That the Committee on Minute Money be directed to send all delinquent accounts of minute money to the Presiding Elders and request them to collect the same during their first and second Quarterly Conference rounds, and to send the money so collected as soon as possible to the Conference Secretary.

N. B.—These resolutions are reprinted from the minutes of 1902 by order of the Conference.

We, the Committee on Periodicals, beg leave to report the following: After careful examination we find no purer or more healthful literature than that published by our Book Concern, and in its mechanical work will compare more than favorably with any other publishing house in the land. Therefore

Resolved, That we give them the preference over all others in our purchases, and urge our churches, Sunday Schools, Epworth Leagues and young people's societies to do the same.

Resolved, That we recommend all the periodicals published by our Book Concern as worthy of the patronage of our people. The Methodist Review, edited by the Rev. W. V. Kelley, D. D., is pronounced by competent judges to be superior to any religious reviews in our country, and it should be taken and read by our ministers and laymen. It can only report for what it believes to obtain within the bounds of this Conference, a section of which clings to this Atlantic seaboard, where cities, towns and suburban villages come within the reach of tremendous influence tending to Sabbath desecration seen or unseen. There is a trinity in unity in the ordainment of God; the Gospel, the Sabbath and the ministry are parts of one great proviso looking to and working for the moral wel-

fare of man that which divine wisdom ordains. Abides and in its abiding appeals to mind, evidencing the beneficence, the purpose and the overruling of God.

At no former period of time within the bounds of this Conference was there so great a disregard not only of the institution of God and the moral interest of man but also of the statutory law which indorses the Biblical appeal for the day of rest and worship. We deplore that which many worthy Christians, men of our own and other denominations of their much needed Sabbath rest and religious privileges, the unnecessary traveling for pleasure on the Lord's day and too painfully evident at our sea beaches and along all of our main public highways fills us with gravest apprehension for the future. We honor the women of the Christian Temperance Union for their vigilance and their courage and we pledge them our hearty support, recognizing the fact that we are no minor part of the moral force of this great nation. We must see to it that Methodism by being most true to itself is also true to every moral principle that is woven into the fiber our constitution. We must utter no uncertain sound in the battle waged with unrighteousness.

The inducements made by corporations to increase their revenue by enlarging the volume of Sunday traffic is to be deplored and whereas the Sabbath stands for law and good morals. And be it

Resolved. That we, the members of the Delaware Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, will contend for our God-given Sabbath, the day of rest. Be it further

Resolved. That all of our ministers and people are truly, earnestly requested to keep the Lord's day sacred, for without a holy day Christianity cannot exist, for it is also the chief fortress of Christian civilization, for it is God's holy day.
