- 1. Candidates for examination are notified to report at the seat of the Conference at $2\ \mathrm{p.}$ m. on the DAY BEFORE the opening.
- 2. Letters of inquiry concerning details of each year's work should be addressed to the first named Examiner.
- 3. Examiners of the several classes are requested to arrange the work according to their preferences and to comply with the Disciplinary instructions. See Appendix, paragraph 65, sections 3 and 7.

RULES OF ORDER.

Rule I. The President shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Conference; but in case of such appeal, the question shall be taken without debate.

Rule II. He shall appoint all committees not otherwise specially ordered by the Conference.

Rule III. On assigning the floor to any member of Conference, he shall distinctly announce the name of the member to whom he assigns it.

Rule IV. All motions or resolutions introduced by any member shall be presented in writing, if the President, Secretary, or any two members request it.

Rule V. When a motion or resolution is move and seconded, or a report is presented, and is read by the Secretary, or stated by the President, it shall be deemed in possession of the Conference; but any motion or resolution may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of Conference, at any time before amendment or decision.

Rule VI. The motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, to take from the table, or for the previous question, shall be taken without debate.

Rule VII. No new motion or resolution shall be entertained until the one under consideration has been disposed of, which may be done by adoption or rejection, unless one of the following motions shall intervene, which shall have precedence in the order in which they are here placed, namely:
(1) To fix the time to which the Conference shall adjourn. (2) To adjourn. (3) To lay on the table. (4) For the previous question. (5) To postpone to a given time. (6) To refer to a committee. (7) Substitute. (8) Amendment. (9) To postpone indefinitely.

Rule VIII. A substitute or amendment may be amended.

Rule IX. When any member is about to speak in debate, or to deliver any matter to the Conference, he shall rise and respectfully address the President.

Rule X. No member shall be interrupted when speaking, except by the President to call him to order when he departs from the question, or uses personalities or disrespectful language; but any member may call the attention of the President to the subject when he deems a speaker out of order, and any member may explain if he thinks himself misrepresented.

Rule XI. No person shall speak more than twice on the same question, nor more than fifteen minutes at one time, without leave of the Conference; nor shall any person speak more than once until every member choosing to speak shall have spoken.

Rule XII. When any motion or resolution shall have been acted upon by the Conference it shall be in order for any member who voted with the prevailing side to move a reconsideration; but a motion to reconsider a non-debatable motion shall be decided without debate.

Rule XIII. No member shall absent himself from the service of the Conference without leave, unless he is sick or unable to attend.

Rule XIV. No member shall be allowed to vote on any question who is not within the bar at the time when such question is put by the President, except by leave of the Conference, when such member has been necessarily absent.

Rule XV. Every member who is within the bar at the time the question is put shall give his vote, unless the Conference, for special reasons excuse him.

Rule XVI. It shall be in order for any member to call for the yeas and nays in any question before the Conference; and, if the call be sustained by twenty-five members present, the vote thereon shall be taken by yeas and nays.

Rule XVII. It shall be in order to move that the question shall be taken without further debate, on any measure pending before the Conference, except in cases where character or Conference relations are involved; and, if sustained by a two-thirds vote, the question shall be so taken; nevertheless, it shall be in order under this rule to move to recommit, to divide, or to lay on the table after the previous question has been ordered.

Rule XVIII. The motion to adjourn shall be taken without debate, and shall always be in order, except (1) when a member has the floor; (2) when a question is actually put, or vote is being taken; (3) when a question is pending on sustaining the demand for the previous question; (4) when the previous question has been called and sustained, and action under it is still pending; (5) when a motion to adjourn has been negatived, and no business or debate has intervened; and (6) when a motion to fix the time to which the Conference shall adjourn is pending or shall be made.

FIRST DAY-Morning Sessioin, Thursday, March 17, 1910.

The Bishop announced Hymn 315, "Nearer My God to Thee." For the

scripture lesson he read John 1: 1-18, and then led in prayer.

Assisted by the District Superintendents and Drs. W. H. Brooks and C. C. Jacobs, the Bishop administered the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Roll Call—By request of the Bishop, J. H. Blake, Secretary of the last Conference, called the Roll and one hundred and twenty-six members and six probationers were present.

Secretary Elected—On motion of J. R. Waters, J. H. Blake was elected Secretary by acclamation.

Assistant Secretaries Elected—On nomination of J. H. Blake, J. W. Fenderson, H. T. Johnson, F. H. Butler, J. R. Holland, J. W. Jefferson and C. S. Sprigg were elected Assistant Secretaries.

Statistical Secretary Nominated—On motion of N. W. Moore, E.O.Parker was nominated; T. H. Kiah nominated T. W. Cooper and R. G. Waters nominated J. U. King.

Tellers Appointed—The Bishop appointed the following tellers: J. R. Waters, R. G. Waters, and A. Chase.

Treasurer Elected—On motion of J. H. Scott, C. W. Pullett was elected Treasurer by acclamation.

Assistant Treasurers—On nomination of C. W. Pullett, C. A. Tindley, D. H. Hargis, S. S. Jolly, A. L. Martin, W. J. L. Hughes, P. M. Shelton, W. S. Brown, R. G. Riley, and J. L. Parker, were elected Assistant Treasurers.

Bar of the Conference—On motion of E. E. Parker, the Bar of the Conference was made the first six seats across the room.

Meeting and Closing—On motion of J. H. Scott, the sessions were ordered to begin at 8:30 A. M. and close at 12 M., the first half hour to be given to devotions. The Bishop was requested to address the devotional meeting on "The Books that God Wrote."

Methodist Review—On motion of J. C. Dunn, W. R. A. Palmer was appointed to canvass for the Methodist Review.

Standing Committees—By request of the Bishop, J. R. Brown read the list of the Standing Committees.

Highest Number of Votes—On motion of J. E. Cook, the person receiving the highest number of votes for Statistical Secretary was to be declared elected. E. O. Parker received 51; T. W. Cooper, 37, and J. U. King, 32.

Statistical Secretary Elected—E. O. Parker having received the highest number of votes, was declared elected Statistical Secretary.

Assistant Statistical Secretaries—E. O. Parker nominated the following for Assistant Statistical Secretaries: T. W. Cooper, J. U. King, T. H. Kiah, R. H. Wallace, J. H. Stevenson and J. W. Jewett.

Programme—The Address of Welcome was made by W. T. Memsley. Bishop W. F. Anderson made the response.

Introduced—The following were introduced: Dr. M. C. B. Mason, Secretary of the Freedmen's Aid Society; Dr. J. B. Hingley, Secretary of the Board of Conference Claimants, and Bishop T. B. Neely.

Memorial Service—By request of Bishop Anderson, Bishop Neely presided at the Memorial Service.

Memoirs Read—J. L. Davis read a memoir on P. T. Scott. E. E. Parker led in singing, "Servant of God well done." C. S. Sprigg read the memoir on C. E. Hemsley. "Shall we meet beyond the river," was sung by Bishop Anderson.

Other Memoirs—On motion of J. H. Scott, Memoirs of widows and children were ordered to be printed in the Minutes.

Speakers for Deceased—On motion of S. S. Jolly, one person was requested to speak to the memory of each brother. J. C. Dunn spoke for P. T. Scott and W. C. Dickerson spoke for Charles E. Hemsley.

Introduced—Dr. J. B. Hingley, Corresponding Secretary of the Board of Conference Claimants, was introduced and addressed the Conference.

Time Extended-On motion of W. C. Jason, time was extended.

Collect Accounts—The Bishop appointed W. R. A. Palmer to collect the accounts of the New York Book Room.

Episcopal Fund—On motion of J. R. Waters, the apportionment of the Episcopal Fund was authorized.

Board of Stewards—On motion of S. S. Jolly, 15 per cent. of the money raised by the local Churches for the support of Conferences, in addition to the \$125 dividend from the Conference Claimants Board, was set aside for special or necessitous cases.

Anniversaries of the Woman's Home Missionary Society—On motion of S. S. Jolly, the meeting of the Woman's Home Missionary Society was announced for 2 P. M., Friday.

World Wide Peace Movement—On motion of C. A. Tindley, five persons were ordered appointed on the World Wide Peace Movement. The Bishop appointed the following: W. C. Jason, J. H. Blake, N. W. Moore, J. R. Waters and C. A. Tindley.

Mayor's Communication—A communication from the Mayor of the City of Philadelphia, stating his inability to be present, was read.

Adjournment—Doxology was sung and benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

FIRST DAY-Afternoon Session, March 17, 1910.

Opening—The devotions were conducted by the Bishop. "Jesus Lover of My Soul" was sung, and Dr. M. C. B. Mason led in prayer.

Hymns Sung-By request of the Bishop, several Hymns were sung.

Introduced—Dr. J. A. Gutterridge, of the American University, was introduced and addressed the Conference; and also Rev. A. C. McCrea, of the Newark Conference.

Statistical Roll Call—The Statistical Roll was called and the charges were reported.

Introduced—Dr. John F. Goucher, of Goucher College, Baltimore, was introduced and addressed the Conference in the interest of Morgan College.

Time Extended-On motion of J. H. Scott, time was extended.

Introduced—Dr. J. O. Spencer, President of Morgan College, was introduced and addressed the Conference in the interest of the Carnegie Fund.

Memoirs—On motion of W. C. Dickerson, all matters referring to deceased Bishops were ordered to be referred to the Committee on Memoirs.

Session at 4 P. M.—On motion of A. R. Shockley, a session of the Conference was ordered to be held at 4 P. M.

Public Worship—On motion of W. C. Jason, a Committee on Public Worship was appointed. The Bishop appointed the following; W. T. Hemsley, C. A. Tindley, J. H. Scott, J. R. Waters, J. C. Dunn, A. F. Ennals and J. W. Parker.

Introduced—The following were introduced: Revs. W. W. Lucas, Field Agent of the Board of Foreign Missions; W. R. Gullins, of the A. M. E. Church; J. A. Pierson, of the New Jersey Conference; R. E. Johns, Editor of the South Western Christian Advocate, and F. L. Jewett, of the Newark Conference.

Adjournment—Doxology was sung and benediction was pronounced by Dr. J. F. Goucher.

SECOND DAY-Afternoon Session, March 18, 1910.

Lecture—The Bishop took the 46th Psalm as the basis of his lecture: "Life's Great Reality." After the lecture, prayer was made by W. R. A. Palmer and E. E. Parker led in singing, "How Firm a Foundation."

Journal Approved—The journals of the previous day were read and approved.

Freedmen's Aid Appropriation—The Freedmen's Aid Appropriation was announced by the Bishop, and on motion of E. E. Parker, the appropriation was referred to the District Superintendents.

Conference Claimants Check—The Bishop announced the Connectional Fund of \$125 from the Conference Claimants Board.

Fourtcenth Question Resumed—The Effective Elders of the Districts were called, their characters were passed, and they made their reports.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS' REPORTS.

CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

With grateful hearts and humble recognition of the blessings which the Great Head of the Church has bestowed upon us, with a consciousness of our numerous shortcomings, with a sense of our inability to measure up to our opportunities and responsibilities, we approach this moment with a mingling of joy and sadness. While many of our brethren have been on the sick list our ranks have not been broken and with one exception, death has not entered any of our homes. We have received of the bountiful hand of Him who clothes the lilly and feeds the raven, yet all our path was not strown with flowers.

This has been a year of unrest and a year of sacrifice among our work-We have not succeeded as we should have liked and in some respects we have failed. Our roll of conversions, probationers and accessions is not as long as it was last year. Our benevolences are not what we have labored to make them. The majority of our pastors have struggled to lay our educational interests upon the hearts of the people, but we have not attained our hope. We have failed to raise our apportionment for the endowment of Morgan College to make possible the munificent gift of Mr. Carnegie. Under these glaring failures our brethren have been restless. have made every sacrifice which seemed necessary. Some have made heroic efforts and succeeded, others have failed in an heroic effort. contributing causes to our failures may be mentioned the low wages of the average wage earner as inadequate to meet the existing high cost of living. In many cases our people have not had the money to give. Furthermore, there is a spirit of real opposition in some places from persons of influence to any form of benevolences. The cause of Missions and the cause of Education is looked upon by some as unnecessary burdens. Our effort to raise the endowment for Morgan College is sometimes denounced as an outrage upon the people, and especially where there is a large Church debt. This opposition is not always from persons of no learning, but from the educated as well. It is not an easy matter to convince the people with whom we have to do without an object lesson, when dollars and cents are concerned. may be further stated that at the last session of the Conference, three of the strongest charges on the District, namely, Federalsburg, Mardela Springs and Preston, were assigned to other Districts. It is true that Snow Hill, Snow Hill Circuit, Box Iron, Stockton and Chincoteague were assigned to this District, but these five charges are not as strong as the three that were taken away in their benevolent contributions, hence the District in the aggregate sustains a slight financial loss. Then, too, in many places spirituality has been at low-tide all the year. Notwithstanding all these contributing causes, the Lord has been gracious to us and has given us showers of blessings. The conversions in the various Charges number from two to sixty-two and range in age from eight to sixty years. Reports show 589 conversions, 462 probationers, 283 accessions, an increase in the number of Epworth Leagues and an increase in the number of classes of children formed for religious instruction.

Charges.

AIREYS has had a successful year, although it suffered the usual calamity of the so-called camp-meeting season. During the latter part of winter a spiritual wave swept over the Charge, resulting in 23 conversions; probationers, 3; accessions, —. Raised for building and improvements, \$120; benevolences are nearly up to last year and is one of the first Charges in the District to raise its entire apportionment, \$75, of the Carnegie Fund. The return of the pastor, G. W. Townsend, is desired.

BECKWITH, supplied by J. H. Grinnage, has not been quite as successful as last year along financial lines, yet there seems to be signs of moral improvement. Plans have been completed for remodeling the parsonage, most of the lumber having been donated and is on the ground ready for the workmen. Raised on old debts, \$92.20; benevolences partially raised; raised for the Carnegie Fund, \$10. Conversions, 16; probationers, 4; accessions, 4.

BOX IRON was transferred from the Salisbury District at the last session of the Conference and has not learned our way of thinking about our Connectional Interests. The pastor reports that the people will not pay benevolences and that this is the poorest year's work that he has done since he joined the Conference. He reports \$253 raised on old debts and \$50 for the benevolences. Conversions, 3; probationers, 10; accessions, 2. The pastor, E. H. Nichols, suffered an attack of La Grippe during the month of February, which seriously hindered him in his work.

BRIDGEVILLE has had another year of splendid success. Every department of the Church is organized and working. Great stress is laid on the moral and spiritual development of the people. Conversions, 62; probationers, 30; accessions, 11; one class of children formed for religious instruction. Paid on old debts, \$150; benevolences, partially raised. The apportionment for the Carnegie Fund is \$40 and \$30 have been raised. The return of the pastor, J. W. Fenderson, is requested.

BRIDGEVILLE CIRCUIT, at the last session of the Conference, was made up of detachments from Bridgeville and Seaford Circuits and results show the wisdom of such division. There was some little friction at first, but the manliness of the pastor has shown him to be master of the situation. There are better Sunday Schools, better Epworth Leagues, better Church organization in every way than could have been accomplished under the old arrangements. Paid on the new Church at Bethel, \$98; on improvements, \$68. Benevolent apportionments in full. Bridgeville Circuit was

the first Charge in the entire District to raise its full apportionment of the Carnegie Fund, \$30. Conversions, 15; probationers, 18; accessions, 4; two classes of children formed for religious instruction. Malachi Raisin, pastor.

CAMBRIDGE has past through a year of severe trial. The high cost of living, low wages, the scarcity of work during the summer months and the reaction as the result of nine years of toil in building the Church, all have conjoined to make this a year of struggle for both pastor and people. The pastor, like an enthusiastic General, has struggled to rally his forces for great financial battles, but his soldiers were unable to rally to the standard as in former days. The fervidity of his zeal is no less after twelve years of labor than when he began, nor is his devotion to his beloved Zion diminished, only conditions have changed. Raised on old debts, \$700; benevolences partially raised; Carnegie Fund, \$—. Conversions, 3; probationers, 9; one class of children formed for religious instruction. A. L. Martin, pastor.

CAMBRIDGE CIRCUIT has not been as successful this year as last, although the pastor and his wife have labored assiduously with little result. Paid on old debts, \$22.82. Benevolences taken. Conversions, 7; probationers, 13; accessions, 4; 2 classes of children formed for religious instruction; one Epworth League doing good work. The return of the pastor, C. E. Davis, requested.

CHINCOTEAGUE ISLAND is too feeble in membership to support a pastor. The industrial conditions which prevailed in former years do not now exist. The total membership does not number 15. The Fourth Quarterly Conference unanimously requested that this feeble Charge be attached to some other Charge. Conversions, 3; probationers, 11. Benevolences, \$11; paid on old debt, \$19. Supplied by S. T. Hammond.

CHURCH CREEK has surpassed all former records in her finance and organization. This once feeble Charge is now beginning to show signs of strength. Raised for old debts, \$52.50; on improvements, \$17.16; benevolences full and far in advance of last year; the full apportionment for the Carnegie Fund, \$30, has been raised and Church Creek is one of the banner Charges in this particular. Conversions, 14; probationers, 10; accessions, 4. The return of the pastor, W. J. Helm, requested.

CRAPO-No report was received from the pastor.

EAST NEW MARKET has received a new inspiration and has shown much energy under the leadership of the present pastor and his inestimable wife. East New Market is situated in a Camp-meeting center and for years has held the so-called Camp. The pastor holds an uncompromising position against the Camp. No camp was held there this year, and what is better, the Sunday School was kept open with a splendid attendance right in the heart of the Camp season, without excepting a single Sunday. The Junior League is the strongest on the District and meets regularly. The Juniors have turned over to the trustees for improvements, \$31; the Senior, \$16; benevolences full. Conversions, 50; probationers, 49; accessions, 2; 1 class

of children formed for religious instruction. It does seem that God espec—ially blesses the Charges which refuse to desecrate the Sabbath by partici—pating in the most degrading institution among us under the guise of re—ligion. J. R. Brinkley, pastor.

FRANKFORD has had a quiet year. The parsonage has been sold and a new site bought near the Church. Amounts of finances were not included in the pastor's report. Conversions, 9; probationers, 8; accessions, 12; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction. Benevolences about equal to last. D. R. Dunn, pastor.

HARRINGTON is a hard Charge to serve. Reports show that it is as far behind its record of last year as it was in advance last year of the record over the previous year. The pastor has tried to make things go, but only the faithful few have stood loyally. Paid on improvements, \$103.58; on old debts, \$26; benevolences taken; Carnegie Fund, \$8. Accessions, 6. G. R. Hollis, pastor.

HURLOCK reports \$15 paid on improvements; on old debts, \$98; on parsonage, \$36; benevolences taken; Carnegie Fund, \$30. Conversions, 19; probationers, 19; accessions, 5; 3 classes of children formed for religious instruction. J. W. Bowling, pastor.

LAUREL reports another successful year's work. Paid on old debts, \$142; on improvements, \$22; benevolences, nearly full; the total apportionment for the Carnegie Fund has been raised, \$105. Conversions, 28; probationers, 19; accessions, 28; : class of children formed for religious instruction. The return of the pastor, R. H. Wallace, requested.

LEWES still forges to the fore. Conversions, 2; probationers, 7. Paid on building and improvements, \$80; on old debts, \$51. Benevolences full and in advance of last year. Raised for the Carnegie Fund, \$29. The return of the pastor, J. W. Cook, is earnestly requested, and he is saying forever here let me abide.

LINCOLN is rated as one of our best Charges. Raised for building and improvements, \$145; on old debts, \$276; benevolences nearly full. Conversions, 8; probationers, 14; accessions, 16; 2 classes of children formed for religious instruction. The return of the pastor, F. C. Wright, requested.

LINKWOOD has made great progress during the past year. A much needed new church has been built at Thompsontown at a cost of \$1500 and \$770 have been paid on the same; on improvements, \$10; on old debts, \$30; the benevolences are in advance of last year and \$50 besides on the Carnegie Fund. Conversions, 25; probationers, 25; accessions, 5; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction. The return of the pastor, G. T. Fields, is prayed for.

Madison seems to have the best report in her history. All the benevolent collections are increased over last year. Paid on old debts, \$30; benevolences, \$120, besides the Carnegie Fund, which is, \$—. Conversions, 21; probationers, 14; accessions, 7; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction. The return of the pastor, W. C. West, is earnestly requested.

MILFORD. The pastor has been unwell most of the year and from present indications is on the border of nervous prostration. We have advised him to take Supernumerary relation for one year in order that he may recover, but this he is unwilling to do. Owing to the moral and spiritual condition of the Church and the pastor's nervous condition, very little has been accomplished in Church work, except what sister Hubbard has been able to direct. Paid on old debts, \$71; raised for benevolences, \$25; raised for the Carnegie Fund, \$15. Probationers, 9; accessions, 8. J. H. B. Hubbard, pastor.

MIDDLEFORD is a mission station with 27 members. It is an experiment which has proven very satisfactory to themselves. They are an heroic little band. They have paid the pastor, \$175, and sent \$15 benevolences to the Conference and contributed \$5 for the Carnegie Fund. The work has been supplied by brother G. W. Fisher, and they ask that their pastor be returned to them. Both parties are well pleased.

NASSAU AND REHOBOTH have done well. Pastor and people have labored together amicably. Paid on new Church at Belltown, \$300; on entire old indebtedness, \$410; benevolences, good under the circumstances; raised for the Carnegie Fund, \$10. Conversions, 20; probationers, 8; accessions, 25; 2 classes of children formed for religious instruction. D. W. Martin, pastor. His return is requested.

NORTH BERLIN is at her usual place, in the front ranks with an increase of total benevolences over last year. Conversions, 16; probationers, 16; accessions, 15; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction. Raised for improvements, \$45; on organ, \$52; on the Carnegie Fund, \$45, a total of \$111 from this Charge for this cause. The people of Berlin love their pastor and earnestly request his return. J. F. Molock, pastor.

SEAFORD has done remarkably well this year. The people have seen the wisdom of the division. They have felt the weight and influence of the pastor in the Sunday Schools and Epworth Leagues. They have just awakened to what they were missing when they were all together. A gracious revival swept over the Charge resulting in 50 conversions; 38 probationers; 7 accessions. Raised for improvements, \$69.58; paid on old debts, \$55. The benevolences are nearly equal to what they were before Bethel Church was detached. Raised for the Carnegie Fund, \$40. The people greatly love the pastor and desire his return. C. W. Downs, pastor.

SNOW HILL has been unfortunate in two respects. During the first month of the Conference year, the Snow Hill Woodworking Company's plant was burned to ashes. This plant gave employment to almost all the male members of Ebenezer Church. Finding themselves without employment these men were compelled to leave home in search of work in order that they might support their families. The second misfortune which has befallen the Church was the illness of the pastor. The Church was, practically, without pastoral supervision for more than six weeks. During this time the pastor lingered between life and death. Brother D. W. Quillen supplied the work during the remainder of the pastor's illness and rendered valua-

ble service. Through the mercies of God and medical skill Bro. Deakins was restored to health and took charge of his work the latter part of August, and, notwithstanding these unfortunate happenings, a remarkable year's work has been accomplished. Paid on old debts, \$145; benevolences, \$124; Carnegie Fund, \$—. Conversions, 55; probationers, 53; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction. L. W. Deakins, pastor.

SNOW HILL CIRCUIT is an heroic little band who have caught the spirit of their leader. They are willing and trying to move upward. They have the desire to be numbered with the best. Paid on old debts, \$9; benevolences in advance of last year, \$—. Conversions, 12; probationers, 8; accessions, 4; 3 classes of children formed for religious instruction. Every dollar of the apportionment for the Carnegie Fund was paid last year. Supplied by C. H. Spencer, whose return is urgently requested.

SOUTH BERLIN still moves upward. The pastor is quiet, righteous, unassuming, but a powerful workman for God, whose power is seen in whatsoever field he labors. Opposition seems to draw out the best that is in him. He seldom complains. Paid on New Bethel Church, \$323.52; on improvements, \$78; total amount paid on old debts, \$415. Benevolent apportionments full and in advance of last year. Carnegie Fund, \$—. Conversions, 21; probationers, 9; accessions, 14. G. W. Downs, pastor.

STOCKTON, C. L. Anderson, pastor, reports paid on improvements, \$240; on new Church, \$80; on parsonage, \$47; total amount paid on old debts, \$127; benevolences in advance of last year; Carnegie Fund, \$10. Conversions, 42; probationers, 17; accessions, 39; 3 classes of children formed for religious instruction.

TRINITY has regained her former position in the District under the leadership of the present pastor. But the congregation at Friendship has sustained a serious loss. One night in February, of this year, their Church building was burned to ashes. There was not a cent of insurance. In almost every Quarterly Conference for the past five years, I have insisted upon the trustees to insure the Church, pointing out the probability of fire. They were heedless and negligent. This ought to be a warning to all uninsured Churches. Paid on old debts, \$30; benevolences in advance of last year. Conversions, 15; probationers, 4; accessions, 7. I. D. Paine, pastor.

VIENNA is to be congratulated for her energy and courage. The debt of about \$500 is paid off with the exception of a few dollars. They declare that they will correct the mistake which was made in the onset by employing a competent architect and builder, tear down what is necessary and start afresh. Paid on old debts, \$—; on improvements, \$—; benevolences nearly equal to that of last year; the full apportionment of the Carnegie Fund paid, \$50. Conversions, —; probationers, —; accessions, —. The return of the pastor, L. H. Martin, is requested.

WHALEYVILLE, supplied by D. G. Waters, has had a very successful year. Every department of the Church has felt the zeal and enthusiasm of this young pastor. Two Epworth Leagues and three Ladies' Aid Societies

have been organized and they have done a noble work. Paid on building and improvements, \$50.75; on old debts, \$34; benevolences full and far in advance of last year; Carnegie Fun, \$12. Conversions, 35; probationers, 39; 1 class of children formed for religious instruction.

The Ladies' Aid Societies.

The Ladies' Aid Societies of the District have increased in number and efficiency. No workers among us deserve to be mentioned more than they. Their reports are as follows: Aireys, — members, \$55; Beckwith, 18 members, \$20; Box Iron, 16 members, \$21; Bridgeville, 50 members, \$150; Bridgeville Circuit, 37 members, \$76; Cambridge Circuit, 30 members, \$95.93; Church Creek, 20 members, \$16.76; Crapo, — members, \$—; East New Market, 60 members, \$227; Frankford, — members, \$132.58; Harrington, 7 members, \$27; Lewes, — members, \$80; Lincoln, 63 members, \$97; Linkwood, 30 members, \$76; Madison, — members, \$50; Milford, 20 members, \$22; Nassau and Rehoboth, 54 members, \$35; North Berlin, 20 members, \$70; Seaford, 30 members, \$104.40; South Berlin, 106 members, \$300.00; Stockton, — members, \$14; Vienna, — members, \$56.65; Whaleyville, 84 members, \$86.90. These societies raised for the Churches nearly \$1800.00. They deserve the highest commendation.

Summary.

Reports from pastors show that we have raised for Foreign Missions, \$447; for Board of Home Missions and Church Extension, \$403; for Freedmen's Aid, \$253; for Conference Claimants, \$321; for Carnegie Fund, \$710. Some of these collections have decreased from last year and some have increased. The aggregate of collections, however, is \$2,929, an increase of \$317 over last year.

CENTREVILLE DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

In response to the call we return from the various posts to which we were sent that we may answer roll call and present reports of the work we have accomplished in our efforts to advance the cause of our Lord.

I am thankful to say in submitting this, my first Annual Report for the Centreville District, that our Ministerial Rank has not been broken by death, and that most of the brethren have escaped without encountering illness of a serious nature. Bro. J. C. Bantom has suffered two severe attacks, the last confining him to his home in almost a helpless condition since the 22nd of Dec., 1909, and from which he is just recovering and has ventured to attend this session of Conference.

Brothers A. Chase, J. T. Fletcher and others of adjoining charges by their labors rendered faithful services to the work during brother Bantom's illness, thus preventing the serious effect that would otherwise have occurred.

Mrs. I. D. Pitts was critically ill during the months of November and December, but we are thankful to say has fully recovered.

The shadow caused by death has fallen in several homes; on May 14th Mrs. J. T. Fletcher was bereaved of her beloved mother, Mrs. Martha E. Wilson; the deceased was a consistent christian and a faithful member of Metropolitan M. E. Church in Baltimore, Md.

Mrs. S. J. Friend, a sister of the Rev. J. R. Holland, died Oct. 29th, 1909. She was victorious in life and peaceful in death.

Blanche A. F. Hall (age 13), the daughter of Rev. and Mrs. C. J. Hall, was called hence, leaving gloom in their home, Oct. the 26th, 1909. She was in her life an angel of sunshine and cheer to their home. Of each we may say, 'twas the Master's call and they've obeyed, we loved them but dare not chide.

A View of the Work.

Whatever of success the year has produced in this field of labor, a great share of the credit is due to my predecessor, who worked well the field, enriching it with his wisdom and goodness; making so plain the work and the plan of the District that a follower could not fail to grasp the work at once, I do not wish to advance his age by the expression; but no father could be more painstaking with a beloved son than has the brother been with his humble successor in order to make the work committed to my care succeed.

The faithful pastors and their companions have done their best by examples of unstinted labor to make me hopeful in my new field of labor, in this also the lay members and friends of the church have joined heartily, producing unity and confidence throughout the year.

The District has many conditions existing in it that makes success in many of the charges far from easy to obtain for many families seem obliged to follow the berry fields during that season for a livelihood, causing many churches to be almost deserted at a time of the year when the most effective work in the charge should be done, the work because of this fact is left to the most uncertain season when they must depend on the oyster industry, which is often paralyzed by bad weather or very low prices, often running as low as fifteen cents a bushel, so the reports, out of these adverse conditions, can be justly considered marvelous.

Notwithstanding the conditions above mentioned it can be easily seen that no part of the work, or call from the church, can be neglected without inviting disaster, and prolonging troubles that only true righteousness can cure; on every hand this truth can be observed.

In every movement of the age and especially with the people I serve, can be seen the need of the "faith that will not shrink though pressed by every foe", for we have many storm clouds; one breaks only to be followed by another, darker and more terrifying, for we live where untiring efforts

are constantly made to discount manhood and crush the hopes of all alike whose lot it is to be wrapped in dark skin.

We look with longing hearts upon such efforts as are fostered in the Carnegie offer to perpetuate that sort of education best adapted to fit men everywhere for living to the glory of God and fellowman; therefore we urge no let up until the last dollar is raised, this cry is joined by many of our pastors, and without doubt will be the word of all.

We have not enjoyed such a sweeping revival wave as we hoped would be our pleasure to report, though in several places the copious showers of this year will be long remembered, the charges report 584 conversions, and 545 accessions.

Our Sunday Schools are in a healthy condition, though a more perfect mark in this department is prevented by the summer meetings which always scatter the forces for man, weeks when traveling is possible, then the winter follows which always reduces the attendance in rural schools, withal eighteen Cradle Rolls with marked improvement in many classes for religious instruction are signs of a growing interest in this worthy department.

The Epworth League Chapters are alive on the District and in most churches they give evidence of that life by the spirit of their devotional meetings; to these meetings much of the revival spirit in our churches is indebted.

The Methodist Brotherhood has not thrived as we hoped in our midst this year, though every effort has been put forth to show its value; St. Michaels has the honor of the only chapter reported on this District.

The spirit of church building has entered several communities with fine success, the result is that one church has been renovated to the extent of being now as good as new, the church at Star on the Cordova Circuit has this honor; while the Mission on the same charge has a fine well built new church. The remaining honors belong to Centreville, Kent Island, and McDaniel, each having commodious churches in course of erection, each being nearly complete.

The Woman's Home Missionary Society.

This work I fear is not receiving the encouragement and general support that it deserves on the District, nevertheless the work is growing, for it is fortunately, on the hearts of a number of fearless and sincere advocates whose labor should be rewarded with an active auxiliary in every charge, such must certainly occur if we would avoid retarding the progress of our unfortunate people.

Charges.

CARMICHAEL—This charge is happy in the onward and upward movement of the work. The revival fire has touched the hearts of many, they report conversions, 40; accessions, 33. Raised on old debts and for improvements, \$426. Benevolences, \$86.

CENTREVILLE STATION has, under the leadership of Bro. Shelton, shown themselves very much alive, they have obeyed the command "Go for-

ward"; the result is that the long looked for new church is erected at a cos of \$3,500, on which \$975 have been raised and paid. The parsonage also has shared this blessing, for a new porch covering front and side makes beautiful home as well as a convenient one. The dedication of the new edifice is looked forward to in the month of May. The pastor well deserves the name of one who brings things to pass, for one after another building arise to bless his memory. Amid the work of building no part of the church work has been neglected. For benevolence he brings \$202. To the Carnegie Fund, \$26. Conversions, 17. Accessions, 14. Raised for all purposes \$2106.

CENTREVILLE CIRCUIT is manned by a hard working, painstaking pastor. The effect of his good work will be lasting, this the people are beginning to learn, and the work has advanced despite their many difficulties—Conversions, 3; accessions, 3. For improvements, \$82. Benevolences taken in part, amount \$37.

CHESTERTOWN verifies the fact that it is possible to grow in years and strength. Their report for the benevolent cause this year will exceed that of any previous report, for the word is "everything" full and that means much more this year than usual, but they add "And running over." The apportionment for the Carnegie Fund is full, also that for the African Diamond Jubilee. Total raised for benevolent causes, \$300. The church is thoroughly organized and is spiritually alive. Conversions, 20; accessions, 20. A new bell weighing more than 1000 pounds now tolls the hour service. Raised and paid for improvements, \$326. The pastors return for the seventh year is earnestly requested.

CHURCH HILL still enjoys the leadership of their tried and true pastor. Rev. F. J. Lee, they say, is the right man in the right place. This we have reason to believe, for the work is advanced and harmony prevails. Benevolence looked after. Conversions, 15; accessions, 12. Reported \$67. The pastors return is desired.

CORDOVA not only continues her good record for spiritual work by reporting 35 conversions and 34 accessions; but has erected one new church costing about \$600, and remodeled another costing \$500, making practically a new church of that. Raised and paid on the work, \$300, with very easy terms to raise the balance. Benevolence, \$145; applied to the Carnegie Fund, \$60.

DENTON—This charge has not slacked its pace, but has continued to rally to every call made for the advancement of the church, both local and general. The church in Denton is now free from debt and about \$50 will free the church at Thomastown from the remnant of a long standing debt, this would be a great blessing to the work there and secure our work. The people of this charge prove themselves good and loyal, in that they are willing to sacrifice to every worthy cause. Raised for debt and improvements, \$442. Benevolence, \$147. For the African Diamond Jubilee, \$15. This means every cause full and overflowing—a very good habit adopted by the pastor and his people. Conversions, 32; accessions, 29. His return is desired.

EASTON—This work has just enjoyed a great revival quickening in life of the church, resulting in 37 conversions and 28 accessions. This is the result of seed sowing and nurture. Every interest of the church is looked after with care, the organization is splendid and tends towards making systematic giving help in advancing the spirituality of the charge. Raised for benevolence, \$186. To the Carnegie Fund, \$20. The work of the W. H. M. S. is alive and every effort is put forth to make it effective; in all that section this work deserves encouragement.

EASTON CIRCUIT has a bright future, conditions are favorable and under the management of the worthy pastor, the point of self-support is nearer. The benevolences are advanced above previous reports, the spirit of benevolence grows. This work has nurtured and given to the pastor a bride. S. J. Hammond is pastor.

FAIRLEE is a prosperous work; this is easily seen in the lovely places of worship erected and remodeled during the present pastorate. The reports show that the work is prospering on all lines. Conversions, 7; accessions, 10. To the Carnegie Fund, \$80; total benevolences raised, \$215.

FEDERALSBURG—This work became a part of the Centreville District last Conference, was formerly of the Cambridge District. The possibility of this charge becoming one of our strongest if properly managed is indeed great. Two churches compose the charge, the church in town has a mass of young people looking to it for spiritual food and training. The need of a new church in this rapid growing town is great, and looking to this end the Ladies' Aid Society has purchased and given to the organization a suitable lot, and we hope same may soon be graced with the much needed structure. Raised for improvement, \$110. Benevolence, \$143. Conversions, 4; accessions, 12. The church is well organized and hopeful.

GREENSBORO—This work was subjected to a change of pastors after many years of loving service, but are showing wisdom and loyalty in their efforts to continue the work of the Lord with whom He has sent. They report \$60 on improvements. Benevolence, \$172. Carnegie Fund, \$14. Conversions, 12; accessions, 14. The charge is well organized, the pastor and people with a full report, are hopeful for future good.

LONGWOOD reports another year of forward movement. The church at Copperville is improved with tower and bell, and with an improved interior at a cost of \$109. Expended for improvements at Longwood also \$13. Total expended, \$160. Benevolence, \$81. Carnegie Fund, \$1. Conversions, 6. The pastor is closing the sixth year on this work.

McDANIEL under the leadership of J. M. Dickerson, who was appointed to supply this work, has lost no ground, but in leaps and bounds has gone forth towards the goal. A new church at McDaniel is in course of erection, with plan for payment made to suit the people. Raised for said purpose, \$300. Benevolence, \$99. Carnegie Fund, \$10. Conversions, 12; accessions, 8. All departments of the church are cared for.

MELITOTA—There is more hope for development in this work thatever, because of the destruction of an evil near the work long defiant and destructive to many of our people. The goods sold, they called pear ciderbut it made folks drunk. Many futile attempts preceded this last to uprootit. Now that the merchant has fled, christians should rejoice. Raised for improvements, \$103; benevolences, \$35. Conversions, 10; accessions, 11.

OXFORD has a hard working loyal people, who, despite the season's slackness, have done well. The church erected last year has been dedicated and given a finishing touch. Raised for improvements, \$28. Paid on indebtedness, \$229. Benevolences, \$58. Carnegie Fund, \$5. Conversions, 12; accessions, 13. The pastor has worked hard and deserves commendation.

PRESTON is an addition to this work. Was formerly of the Cambridge District. This charge is strong and able, because of its large membership of prosperous tillers of the soil. Revival fires have burned upon their alters. They report, as a result, 45 conversions, 32 accessions. Amount raised for improvements, \$40. Benevolences, \$114. Carnegie Fund, \$15. Life is evident in every part of this work.

POMONA—This is a great charge, both in numbers that compose it, and the scope that it covers. The care that should be given the mass of young people in order to properly develop this work is more than one pastor can give, it is needful therefore that preparation for division should begin, for many precious souls are at stake. The pastor is not afraid of work and has wrought well, and reports for improvements on two churches, \$250. Benevolence, \$148. Conversions, 4; accessions, 4. The condition here, financially, depends largely on the oyster industry, which, like in many other places, has been a failure; notwithstanding this, the gifts of the people for the benevolent cause has not decreased.

RIDGELY—The misfortune of having their pastor disabled by illness during the last two months of the Conference year will affect to a great extent this report, which equals that of the past year, and bids fair to surpass any of recent years. Raised on benevolence, \$80. Conversions, 11; accessions, 8.

ROYAL OAK has enjoyed a spiritual harvest and reports 63 converts and 59 accessions. Paid on old debts, \$471. Benevolent collections, \$188. To the African Diamond Jubilee, \$7. Carnegie Fund, \$15. The work is advancing on all lines. The pastor and people are happy and they expect his return.

ST. MICHAELS happily reports 43 conversions and 43 accessions as the result of revival fire upon her altar. Benevolent collections are full with \$25 for Carnegie Fund. Total \$213. The purchase of a corner lot and preparation to build a new parsonage marks the added activity of this well organized body. The pastor is ending his fourth year amid greater enthusiasm than when he first began; so brethren quiet your hopes this way.

STEVENSVILLE—This work has encountered another dull oyster season, but would acknowledge no failure; now, the long needed and much talked of church building to be known as Union Memorial is a reality, erected at a cost of \$1,800, on which has been raised and paid the sum of \$575. The pastor has shown himself equal to a great task and deserves credit, he also belongs to the list of church builders. This beautiful edifice will be dedicated in the early part of May. Raised for benevolences, \$84. Carnegie Fund, \$5. African Diamond Jubilee, \$2. Conversions, 13; accessions, 15. The pastors return is invited.

TRAPPE is fully alive, and the pastor is jubilant over the fact that he lives there, adding that he is quite willing to stay there. The parsonage has been renovated, making one of the most beautiful homes in the town, also a barn and carriage house erected, the entire improvement costing \$1,200, with \$450 paid on same. Benevolence, \$97. Carnegie Fund, \$5. Conversions, 68; accessions, 55. The pastor is happy in bringing things to pass, and that he with his people have used the foundation so well laid. Bro. Henry expects to return.

WILLISTON—This work has an encouraging outlook. Reports for benevolence, \$50. Conversions, 14; accessions, 14. The pastor is painstaking and honest, who, if followed, will lead to success.

WITTMAN makes a splendid showing in a keen interest in every cause of the church. Benevolences, \$120. To the Carnegie Fund, \$20. This work is well organized and manned by a corps of faithful workers. Conversions, 3; accessions, 3. The pastor is what may be termed a quiet but sure success.

WOODLAND—This charge has for its pastor a faithful and energetic young man who enjoys the confidence of his people and of the community at large. The year has teemed with spiritual blessings upon all concerned. Conversions, 49, accessions, the same. Paid for improvement, \$75. Raised for benevolences, \$52. Carnegie Fund, 3. The organizations of the charge are carefully nurtured and are prosperous. The people desire the pastors return for another year.

Summary.

The reports show a total raised for benevolence, \$3,223. For Carnegie Fund, \$399. We regret much our failure to fill to overflowing every cause, but these gifts represent hard work and great sacrifice on the part of the faithful givers. It is victory enatched from a land of doubts and fears shorn of the beauty in spirit and practice ascribed to "the land of the midnight sun", though a land in which the shining sun is likened: to those most oppressed, but we are filled with brightest hopes on our way, for the Sun that lightens our path and inspires us in work is the "Sun of Righteousness" and promises a better day.

PHILADELPHIA DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

After a long period of severe illness the wife of Rev. A. F. Ennals, pa tor of our church in Frankford, entered into rest. She was an ideal preacler's wife and her devotion to her husband and his work made her a mod fit to copy by many younger women.

It has been a year of severe illness and suffering for many of our number, but with Pauline fervor, they declared, "None of these things moveme," and as usual, while the years' record is not surprising, it is fully use to our average.

The Christmas blizzard will long be remembered. For weeks the Philadelphia District was buried beneath a blanket of snow, by the severes storm for many years, not only afflicting our city congregations, but for over a month causing a cessation of all meetings in our country appointments.

Yet, despite all these hindrances, we have come up to the Annual Conference with thankfulness to our Heavenly Father, and find so much joy in counting our blessings that we can afford to forget the light afflictions caused by the terrible Winter weather of January.

I regret that I cannot give you a more accurate report, but nearly onethird of our pastors were too careless or indifferent to make out the blank reports I sent them, and hence I cannot tell of the heroic giving of our people as I desire; people who are so loyal and liberal ought to receive some credit at the end of the year.

Epworth League work on the District shows a marked increase in members and interest; Sunday School, ditto, but much of the latter is due to the inspiration of M. C. Jennings, the talented Field Secretary of the Sunday School Board.

The vexing question of our Northern boundary, like Banquo's ghost, will not down. I have honestly tried for the past 14 years, in the midst of a constant storm of fault finding and misrepresentation, to have harmonious relations with the white Conferences to the North and East of us, but in vain.

After being informed by a District Superintendent of the New England Conference that he and his people bitterly opposed a Colored Superintendent presiding over the two churches placed in our territory by the General Conference, I consented not to oppose their transfer back, provided they would take care of these poor missions. After two years of trial, the century-old Revere St. Church of Boston sends its pastor to us for an appointment, but the church is utterly wiped out. New Haven is not much better.

The failure of the colored work in the white Conferences comes from the change in the personelle of the congregations; very few Northern people now attend them, but the new congregation is made up from Southern people who have been used to colored leadership alone. While the Southern colored brother appreciates the kindness of his Northern white friend blood is thicker than water, and while he is made welcome, he cannot be made happy or useful in a mixed church.

St. Mark's in New York city, is a notable example of how to meet this

question: the New York Conference helps and never hinders the membership of this great race church. The colored brother is accorded the fullest freedom and he repays the trust put in him, by doing the very best work of our people in Methodism. I commend the wisdom of the New York Conference to some Conferences nearer home.

The debt of the District is still one of the great hindrances to the spread of our work. If we could only use the thousands paid yearly for interest in developing our work, we could soon make the wilderness bloom and blossom like the rose.

Our ambition is to take this hard territory for Christ, and while it is a mammoth undertaking, we feel neither cast down nor forsaken.

ATLANTIC CITY has not had a very successful year, owing to the lack of harmony and support on the part of the people toward the pastor; it is to be regretted, for the success of the new building enterprise is not helped by such divisions.

BRIDGETON has made substantial progress toward preparing the way for the new church; money in bank, no debt, people encouraged and united.

BRONX has not done well for the year. Like most of our heavily assisted missions it fails to develop the principle of self support.

BROOKLYN has made some substantial improvement, but until it is emancipated from its present surroundings, there will be no permanent growth; pastor and people are making a gallant fight for better things.

BURLINGTON has met with misfortune in the death of one of her most faithful and progressive laymen, but moves on as usual, slow if nat always sure.

CAMDEN is going steadily and pleasantly under its faithful pastor.

CAPE MAY has had new life and hope arisen, and the pastor nourishes wisely every indication of loyalty in order to build up a great future for this city by the sea.

ST. DANIEL'S, CHESTER, under the faithful and skillful leadership of the present pastor, this year, in some respects, surpasses the excellent report of the previous year, with every department of the church in good working order, and improving. This charge has a first class, well organized Sunday School, a growing Epworth League, a good size Junior League, an active and useful Ladies' Aid Society, and a promising W. H. Missionary Society. The benevolent or financial report to the Conference Treasurer, was \$401, including \$90 for the Carnegie Fund.

SILOAM, CHESTER. Good year under difficulties. One of the greatest sessions of the Preachers' Meeting ever held.

FORDSVILLE has put on her beautiful garments and with her renovated church is fair to look upon. Good revival and the outlook for church and people promising.

GRENLOCH AND RHODES has had a blessed year of growth and progress. The new church just opened at Grenloch seems to those of us who remember the former days, to be a direct answer to the prayers of the fathers, and the entire circuit seems to respond grandly to the leadership of the pastor.

HUDSON has had a good year, salaries and collections in full.

MAGNOLIA--no report.

MERCHANTVILLE has had a quiet year of fair progress, and answers the roll call with her usual spirit of loyalty.

MONTCLAIR has had a wonderful year bath spiritual and financial and should be congratulated on her adjustment of the church debt.

MORRISVILLE has made steady progress since its creation into a station, and has become one of the sweetest, most promising and also performing points on the District.

MOUNT HOLLY-no report in time.

NEWARK brings one of the best reports in her history, both Sunday School and Epworth League work is far above the normal, and if some disturbing influences are withdrawn it will develop into one of the very strongest points on our work.

OCEAN CITY AND PLEASANTVILLE, carrying as heavy a burden in proportion to the membership, no charge has done better on the District in every respect; pastor and people are a unit. The way will soon be opened for the erection of a good church in Pleasantville, one of the rapidly growing suburbs of Atlantic City, while the work at Ocean City as usual is of the finest.

ORANGE. The change in the pastorate last year at this point, came near wrecking the entire future of this appointment, for the pastor who asked a transfer to another Conference after it was granted, did all that was in his power to sow the seeds of disloyalty among his former members by his frequent visits and his declarations of ill treatment by the appointing powers. Had it not been for the rare good sense of Dr. Palmer the work would have been injured beyond repair, and for the generosity of Mr. Ferry it would have been impossible. A good revival however cleared the atmosphere and the report of Orange is twice as good as it promised in the early part of the year.

OSSINNING has had a wonderful experience this year, for both white and colored Methodists have been captured by the wonderful religious fervor of Bro. Morris. The Ossinning fires are being answered by other beacon blazes from other points in the Hudson Valley.

CALVARY is one of the grandest experiments in our Philadelphia Methodism. After paying \$5,500 on the old debt it continues to astonish those who know her work by the marvelous ease with which she bears her marvellous burdens, and disappoints the many prophecies of the impossible A great year of blessings and gifts on the part of pastor and people.

FRANKFORD has had a very hard year. Between the blizzard, the car strike, and the death of sister Ennals, who was sick so long, as a consequence, it is no wonder that the extraordinary record of this church should not be equal to former years.

GERMANTOWN never fails and much credit is due to a working pastor and a loyal people. Everything in full.

HAVEN, where the Conference is meeting, is in an exceptionally flourishing condition and she has met in full all demands upon her for the large interest upon her debt, and to meet as far as possible her other demands.

JOHN WESLEY has made an excellent record of hard work and while her debt is a very heavy burden for her small membership of poor people, she is steadily forging to the front.

SOMERVILLE has had more to struggle under than most of our City Missions, but the report of the year's work shows the undiminished zeal of this remarkable people.

ST. PAUL'S. Bro. Smax in a very quiet way is building up the work at 18th and Dickinson. His Sunday School is much larger in numbers and interest than many of the great churches can boast, and the future promises well.

ZOAR, the "Old Reliable," never fails in the hardest of years, and arter paying \$1000 on the old debt, she brings up the benevolent collections in full.

SALEM has had one of the greatest years in her history, and at the same time one of the sweetest. The pastor's return is ardently desired.

SALEM CIRCUIT under the diligent care of Bro. Neilson responded nobly, and while the Penn's Neck Church is still in a weakly condition, yet any loss in that direction is more than made up by the steady growth of Haven Chapel.

SPRING LAKE. Her handsome new chapel is the ideal of a Summer Mission, and I look for great results this coming season.

WHITE PLAINS has had an unfortunate year, but has made some progress and some gain toward the desired goal. It is quite difficult to advance the benevolent work, among our Northern churches as our colored people have not been encouraged to make sacrifices for these great ends.

WOODBURY is the little point where Bro. Haman Ward has built a church which is a monument of his devotion. We must nurse this enterprise as a child, for while feeble it is truly a child of promise.

In concluding this imperfect review of the situation, I thank God for His unfailing care, and also for the strong support of those of my brethren, whose zeal enabled me to present a creditable report in spite of adverse conditions.

SALISBURY DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

Being ourselves mere plodders, and serving a people of very limited means and opportunities, we have nothing remarkable to present. Faithful, not brilliant, is the motto under which we have labored; and we neither expect nor desire any other commendation than that of our Lord, Well done, thou hast been faithful over a few things.

It gives us great joy to report that there is evident growth in Christian character in the churches, and in consequence, a raising of the moral plain of our communities. This blessed change is due to the earnest, constant preaching of those doctrines which may be called the heart of the Gospel: namely, the unique work of Jesus Christ in saving sinners from their sins; imparting the Holy Spirit and the Word whereby they become partakers of the divine nature; and communion with God in Christ as the high privilege of the believer. On the grounds of these truths we exhort the people to be holy as He is holy; to put to death their members which are upon the earth, as fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, anger, wrath, malice, shameful speaking, lying; to reckon themselves to have died indeed with Christ unto sin, and to have been raised up with Him, and made to sit together with Him in the heavenlies. Such is the preaching, and the quickening that always follows such preaching has been realized.

With the enlargement of knowledge and elevation of character there has come a more rational and spiritual mode of worship. The orgies falsely called prayer meetings, with their hideous sights and terrifying sounds, reminding one of the frenzy of a company of dervishes, are beginning to give place to meetings for real prayer and praise; meetings where loyal, longing hearts gather, reverent in spirit, decorious in manner, to see the King in His beauty, to pay their homage at His feet, and to present their petitions. Even that Saturnalia, the camp meeting, that high festival of carnality, that writhing mass of furious folly, that grand concourse of violence, drunkenness, lust, beastliness, profanation, sacrilege, blasphemy:—even the camp meeting is feeling the power of the truth, and is passing away like a horrid nightmare with the coming of the dawn.

Death has three times visited our parsonages. On the 21st of June, early in the evening, brother P. T. Scott was stricken with paralysis of the brain and died within an hour. His last days were his best in the highest sense. He had made a most favorable impression upon the people of Deals Island, both colored and white. His ministry was a benediction, and his death was mourned by both races. His lonely widow, whose simplicity and kindness were very helpful to brother Scott in his work, has our sympathy and our prayers. On Sunday, Oct. 5th, about 1 o'clock P. M., as he was administering the Holy Communion, brother C. E. Hemsley, of Nanticoke, was stricken with paralysis of the brain. He was taken from the altar to his bed, where he died the same afternoon about 4 o'clock. How devoted his life, how glorious his death! He went from commemoration to realization, from faith to vision, from hope to fruition. His wife, a true yokefellow indeed, is sadly bereaved. The people of Nanticoke showed great kindness

to the widow and the children. Brother D. A. Ridout lost his daughter, Florence, on the 13th of November. She was talented, being specially gifted in music. She was sweet spirited, and was the favorite of the rest of the family.

The Rev. M. C. Jennings, the Conference Sunday School Field Missionary, was secured by D. H. Hargis to conduct an institute on Sunday School work at Princess Anne, Dec. 7th. The meeting was well attended by both pastors and laymen. Principal Trigg and several members of his Faculty were present and contributed much to the meeting's success. Brother Jennings, in his quiet manner and clear style, revealed a perfect mastery of his work. We were all enlightened, and inspired with new zeal from the laymen down to the District Superintendent. I regret that so little was raised on our District for the Sunday School work. We must do better next year.

The District Preachers' Meeting was addressed on Feb. 8 by Dr. Ward Platt of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension, on the work of his board. The impression of the magnitude, difficulties, and withal the blessedness of the work, which he made on us cannot soon be effaced, and must bear fruit for the cause. While with us, he visited Princess Anne Academy, and made an inspiring speech to the students. He expressed himself as being highly pleased with the equipment, and the atmosphere of order and discipline which pervades the place. And in this estimate of the Academy, all must concur. And yet the attendance is only 130. Why? The average daily attendance is the best the school ever had, the average age of the students is lower than ever before. All of the departments are in full operation. There are eight different trades taught; and after the student's first year's experience, all of the work done is productive, a fact not generally known. Eighty-five per cent. of the students are church members; and the moral tone grows better every year. There is great need of a domestic science building for girls. The raising of the Carnegie Fund will secure such a building with proper equipment.

Interest in education is growing. Many of the pastors lead the people to lengthen the short school term by subscriptions among themselves. In Wicomico County, the colored children now go to school more than the white children do. And this fact is used by the Courier, the Democratic paper of the county, to stir the white people to educate their children. Education is the one matter of paramount importance to our race. He cannot be called a hobbyist who speaks of it in season and out of season. He cannot be called a fanatic who makes great sacrifices for it himself and calls on others to follow his steps. It is not extravagant to say that without knowledge sweet liberty is but the dream with which the slave seeks to lighten the weight of his fetters and mollify their galling. It is not worship of the intellect to say that without the trained mind, faith easily passes into superstition; doctrine becomes a mere rhapsody of words; experience becomes frrational emotional excitement; and worship becomes an orgy, enervating, degrading.

The indifference of the colored man to Christian education is astonishing and inexplicable. Each new day declares our need; and every experience in the business or pleasures of life, emphasizes our weakness. Living

in the midst of a people who have attained to the highest degree of culturand power yet reached by mankind, and separated from them by a cast which daily grows more bitter, aggressive, and relentless, we have but onway of escape from a condition in comparison with which slavery itself wa an idyllic dream. And that way, a sure and certain one, is Christian edu cation. The Emancipation Proclamation, sealed with the blood of Lincol and many other lovers of liberty, the hundred battle fields where libert stands crowned victor over abhorred tyranny, the Fourteenth and Fifteent Amendments, the various Civil Rights Bills, could not settle the questio= of the place which the colored man is to hold in this country. For thes things glorious and fundamental though they be, are negative condition external to the subject himself. It is the Negro himself, and not the Sum preme Court of the United States before whom the question of his standing as a man is to be determined. He himself will hand down the decision expressed in terms of debasing ignorance, grinding poverty, degrading super stition, dehumanizing vice; or in terms of luminous and adequate know ledge, provident thrift and economy leading to a dignified competence, rational, all-conquering faith, a respect-compelling probity. From the decision of this court of last resort there can be no appeal. Our enemies o Ou the white race know this, and mark their efforts to hold us down. friends know it (thank God that we have so many great and good friends among them!), and they are pouring out thousands to help us. Can we re fuse their help, and continue to hope? To me the Carnegie offer is the voice of God calling us to hope and noble action. It is incredible that and man of our race who believes (he is to be pardoned, if he thinks the news too good to be true) that this great gift has been proffered us, should op pose it. But when we learn that men who have the position of leaders, and affect wisdom and devotion, are either indifferent or actively antagonistic to this great cause, amazed beyond all action or utterance, we pray God to open their eyes, to unstop their ears, to soften their heads, to melt their hearts, to cut loose their tongues, to wing their feet, to untie their pocket books; to move them, or remove them. It is preached and prayed on the Salisbury District, and would be sung, if we had a poet down there. W cannot boast of what we have accomplished, for we have really done to little. But I know that you will rejoice with us that we bring for this cause \$968 this year, last year we reported \$816, which makes a total of \$1784 But there is a balance of \$741 yet to be raised before we can shout. I be lieve the men of our District will raise every dollar of the \$2525 apportion ed us. Race love, not to say pride, philanthropy, gratitude, statesmanship faith in God, as well as righteous resentment against race prejudice, irra tional, brutal, flendish: all these will form one grand irresistible motiv which will sweep us on to victory.

Charges.

COTTAGE GROVE. The unbroken success of J. W. Waters for the past eight years on this charge, makes me jealous for some of the brethre who are members of the Conference, he being only a supply. Raised on ol debts, \$5; repairs, \$162.55; new building, \$1109.34, total, \$1276.89. The

apportionment for the Carnegie Fund was raised last year, but \$9 more is added this year. Benevolences, \$130; Africa, \$7, total, \$146. Conversions, 25; accessions, 5.

CRISFIELD. Raised on old debts, \$800; on repairs, \$100, total, \$900. Raised on the Carnegie Fund, \$46; Africa, \$1; benevolences, \$122, total, \$160. In addition to this excellent work in his church, brother R. G. Waters, the pastor, has been supervising, and sometimes teaching in the school established by his efforts on the Jeans foundation. He has raised \$400 for this work. Well done!

DAMES QUARTER. The people and brother J. L. Davis are mutually well pleased. The work has fully returned to its normal condition, and if employment was to be had, their report would be very large. I need only say that if the oyster himself has no legs, the oyster business has, and one night while the folks were asleep, the business got up and stole away, and they haven't found it yet, though they have sought it with tears. Raised on old debts, \$180; repairs, \$20, total, \$200. Carnegie Fund, \$31; benevolences, \$31, total, \$62. Conversions, 27; accessions, 30.

DEALS ISLAND. After brother Scott's death, mentioned above, I appointed J. R. Purnell to the work. He has been successful, though he had an experience that tested his grace. He stood the test, and the people of the Island are with him, and have done the best they could in their financial straits. Raised for new building, \$13. Benevolences, \$47; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$30, total, \$80.

EXMORE. L. D. Beecham has had charge for the past four years, and the people beg that he be returned to them, they are so pleased with his character and work. Raised on old debts, \$150; repairs, \$20, total, \$170. Benevolences, \$51; Africa, \$1; Carnegie Fund, \$11, total, \$63. Conversions, 30; accessions, 12.

FAIRMOUNT, CENTENNIAL. Her travail is past She is the mother of a second daughter that shows all those traits for which the mother has long been distinguished. Her normal condition has returned and she is working in the old way with her wonted vigor and success. She has 149 members, 95 Sunday School scholars, and 50 enrolled in the Epworth League. There were 25 conversions and 25 accessions. The pastor's salary is \$650, just as of old; and he has a good new parsonage to live in near the church. Raised on old debts, \$25; repairs, \$150; new building, \$395, total, \$570. Benevolences, \$71; Africa, \$6; Carnegie Fund, \$55, total, \$126. The pastor, J. W. Bond, may be called in the language of Isaiah, the repairer of the breech, the restorer of paths to wdell in.

St. Andrew's Church. The wisdom of the establishment of this church is no longer questioned by anyone. The beautiful church dedicated last fall; the easy terms of the debt; the raising of \$1200 on the debt this year; the 133 members, the 150 Sunday School scholars, and 50 Epworthians; the 19 conversions, and 27 accessions: all declare that no malevolent spirit inspired the founders of this enterprise; but that the spirit of progress, the

Spirit of God moved those who severed ties so tender as those which bou all hearts to old Centennial. They pay the pastor \$600, and their benelent report is high considering the debt and the scaracity of work for t people. The Brother, R. G. Riley, may be called in the language of t prophet the nursing father of this young, but vivacious church. His skas a nurse is of the first order, for it is of the home made brand. Benevelences. \$92; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$25, total, \$120.

FRUITLAND. D. A. Ridout quietly takes care of that which is entrused to him. Raised on old debts, \$93; repairs, \$23, total, \$116. Benevelences, \$101; Carnegie Fund, \$17, total, \$118.

GREENWOOD. Brother R. H. Boggs writes me that his people has suffered very greatly this winter. And of course, he has suffered with there But they are heroic, and have sent a liberal offering for the general wors of the church. Raised on old debts, \$50; repairs, \$6, total, \$56. Benevalences. \$47; Cargenie Fund, \$10, total, \$57.

HOPEWELL. Brother J. K. Adams says Hopewell is the best chargeness he ever had, and the people say he is the best pastor they ever had; and they are all happy, and working as they have not worked before during the past five years. A beautiful church is in progress of erection at Hopewell Raised on olddebts, \$12; new building, \$390, total, \$402. Benevolences \$93; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$45, total, \$141.

JAMESTOWN. M. P. Sterling. Scarcity of work will account in some degree for the falling off in the report from this place. But while there is a falling off in the benevolences there has been an increase in the number of conversions over last year. Raised on old debts, \$500; repairs, \$45, total, \$545. Benevolences, \$62; Carnegie Fund, \$5; total \$67. Conversions 38; probationers, 38.

LAWSONIA has not yet become weary of the plain, searching teaching and preaching of brother J. A. Jeffers. On the contrary, they like both his teaching and himself more and more. He believes in organization. His Sunday School has the Home Department with 38, the Cradle Roll with 40 and the Temperance Society with 54, enrolled. There is also a Queen Esther Circle, which is doing great good in saving lost girls. Raised on old debts, \$260; for repairs, \$35, total, \$295. Benevolences, \$137; Africa, \$75 Carnegie Fund, \$24, total, \$168. Conversions, 50; accessions, 52.

LEEMONT. J. E. A. D. Grigsby. It is customary for the brethren to speak of Virginia as of a land full of terrors dire. Brother Grigsby chose to go to Leemont, and he has not had cause to regret his choice. He found a fine country, a fine people, and a fine opportunity to work, and certainly that is what he wanted. Each of his churches has put in a new organ costing together, \$250, more than half of which has been paid. Raised on old debts, \$385; repairs, \$145, total, \$530. Benevolences, \$81; Africa, \$1; Carnegie Fund, \$10, total, \$92. Conversions, 40; accessions, 35.

MARDELA SPRINGS. J. W. Gillis. In the revision of the Districts at the last Conference, Mardela Springs was attached to the Salisbury District It is a strong work, and brother Gillis has handled it most successfully. We welcome both pastor and people back to their home District. Raised on old debts, \$225; repairs, \$240, total, \$465. Benevolences, \$142; Africa, \$4; Carnegie Fund, \$35, total, \$181. Conversions, 44; accessions, 35.

MARION STATION. L. E. Toulson. Their report is far beyond my expectation, and shows the loyalty of both pastor and people; for they have had a hard year. Raised on old debts, \$125; new building, \$440; repairs, \$60, total, \$625. Benevolences, \$99; Africa, \$1; Carnegie Fund, \$25, total, \$125. Conversions, 5; accessions, 3.

MARION CIRCUIT. L. J. Waters. As his way is, he has inspired the people to work; and they have surpassed all they have ever done before for the benevolences, the total reported being \$66, in advance of last year. Paid on old debts, \$162; repairs, \$80, total, \$242. Benevolences, \$69; Africa, \$5; Carnegie Fund, \$21.50, total, \$95.50. Conversions, 2; accessions, 17.

MT. VERNON. W. T. Purnell. The pastor is still attending the Academy at great sacrifice. He is making a fine record in school, and his church work is in fine condition. We preachers are apt to take the salary as the guage of the spirit and growth of a church. Measured by this standard the vitality of Mt. Vernon is phenominal, for they have raised the salary to \$600. Raised on old debts, \$260.10; repairs, \$6.40, total, \$266.50. Benevolences, \$77; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$14, total, \$94. He leaves his church in a glow of revival fire; conversions, 45; accessions, 15.

NANTICOKE. These people have suffered most heavily from the failure of the oyster industry. What they give is certainly an expression of devotion to Christ and His Church. Brother A. R. Shockley was appointed to supply the work after the death of brother C. E. Hemsley. The church was well pleased to have brother Shockley. He is strong and wise, an able preacher and sure spiritual guide. Raised on old debts, \$76. Benevolences, \$26; Carnegie Fund, \$40, total, \$66.

OAK HALL. S. T. Parker. Though a very quiet man, he is one of the most successful pastors. He elevates his people by the preaching of the truth, and the fearless and impartial administration of discipline. Raised on old debts, \$455. Benevolences, \$75; Africa, \$6; Carnegie Fund, \$26, total, \$107. Conversions, 56; accessions, 32.

ORIOLE is not its former self. Brother J. W. W. Cox is a man who is made of kindness. And they say he knows how rightly to divide the Word of Truth. But some churches need kindness and ————. There has been no different quality in the misfortune that has come upon them, from that in the same misfortune that has fallen upon our whole section. They take it differently. Their report could have been better, I believe. Raised on cld debts, \$47; repairs, \$8, total, \$55. Benevolences, \$28; Carnegie Fund, \$3, total, \$31. Conversions, 8; accessions, 6.

PARSONBURG. The procrastination and camp meeting folly that caused the falling off in the benevolences of this place, will not deceive us again. The District Superintendent is sorry, the pastor is sorry, the people are sor-

ry, and we all intend to keep sorry till we retrieve our reputation by bringing a great report next year. They are building a beautiful church at Parsonburg. Brother Rogers is justly very proud of this achievement. Raised on old debts, \$17.26; repairs, \$6.30; new building, \$191.05, total, \$212.61. Benevolences, \$53; Carnegie Fund, \$21, total, \$74. Conversions, 22; accessions, 22.

POCOMOKE CITY. M. L. McKenny. Still the work grows under Bro. McKenny's skillful husbandry. Raised on old debts, \$746. Benevolences, \$116; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$56, total, \$175. Conversions, 41; accessions, 29.

PRINCESS ANNE. D. H. Hargis received his first appointment to this charge last Conference. The difficulties that met him were soon settled and the people have worked in perfect harmony with him and his wife, who is a helpmeet indeed. The report speaks loudly of earnest, well directed effort. Every disciplinary and all other benevolences are raised in full. Benevolences, \$165; Africa, \$8; Carnegie Fund, \$62, total, \$235. Raised on old debts, \$235; repairs, \$60, total, \$295. Conversions, 5; accessions, 22.

PRINCESS ANNE CIRCUIT. A work, weak and small, and yet the pastor, C. T. Covington, brings a good report. For the benevolences, \$46; Africa, \$2; Carnegie Fund, \$34, total, \$82.

QUANTICO has kept the even tenor of her way under W. C. Bowland. Raised on old debts, \$64; repairs, \$20, total, \$84. Benevolences, \$24; Carnegie Fund, \$15, total, \$39.

SALISBURY. C. S. Sprigg ends his third year here. His sincerity and purity have been a great blessing to the community. Raised on old debts, \$36; improvements, \$209, total, \$245. Benevolences, \$217; Africa, \$8; Carnegie Fund, \$101, total, \$328. Conversions, 9; accessions, 9.

SALISBURY CIRCUIT. J. L. Parker, pastor. This is a very hard work, and brother Parker is the man to do it, for he is patient, dependable, resourceful, and is blessed with a wife to the parsonage born, and at home in church work. Raised on old debts, \$272; repairs, \$36; new building, \$10, total, \$318. Benevolences, \$28; Carnegie Fund, \$20, total, \$48. Conversions, 17; accessions, 4.

UNIONVILLE. J. H. Winters. He is greatly beloved by his people, and brings a good report. Raised on old debts, \$47; repairs, \$163; new building, \$18, total, \$228. Benevolences, \$80; Carnegie Fund, \$25, total, \$105. Conversions, 34; accessions, 38.

WACHAPREAGUE. Brother G. B. Coleman has done a good work in repairing the parsonage, as well as in things spiritual. Raised for repairs, \$175; for new building, \$30, total, \$205. Benevolences, \$38; Africa, \$1, total, \$39. Conversions, 40; accessions, 28.

WATTSVILLE. J. S. Coulbourne completes his eighth year at Wattsville in Virginia. His people want him to return, and he wants to return to complete the work of reform and elevation which he has been carrying

on. Raised on old debts, \$400; for repairs, \$131, total, \$531. Benevolences, \$113; Carnegie Fund, \$14, total, \$127. Conversions, 62; accessions, 52.

WETIPQUIN. L. T. Robbins, pastor. Raised on old debts, \$350; repairs, \$50; new building, \$1, total, \$401. Benevolences, \$40; Carnegie Fund, \$12, total, \$52. Conversions, 30; accessions, 25.

WHITE HAVEN. Being short of a man at the adjournment of the last Conference, I. H. Bivins, a local deacon of Marion Station, was placed in charge. Having had large experience at home, he and his wife entered very easily into the work here; and their success goes beyond our hope in a very difficult field. Raised on old debts, \$14; repairs, \$80; new building, \$377.-14, total, \$471.14. The new church is nearly ready for dedication. This is an enterprise of the people themselves, led by brother J. F. Gattis, an exhorter, class leader and trustee. The benevolences are the largest for several years, the total being \$42; Africa, \$3; Carnegie Fund, \$30, total, \$75. Conversions, 11; accessions, 14.

Summary.

The revision of the District last year whereby we lost six churches will account to some extent for the falling off in our benevolences. But local conditions, and the inability of the pastors to handle the people will account for the greater part of our deficit. We have raised for the temporalities, \$10,981.11; for the benevolences, \$2544; for the Carnegie Fund, \$968.00. The Epworth Leagues and Sunday Schools gave \$60 for the special fund for Africa, and the churches report \$78, making \$136. The grand total of the benevolences, Carnegie Fund, and Africa Mission's Diamond Jubilee Fund is \$3648. The Salisbury District will raise its apportionment for these two causes and raise the other benevolences too. We are determined.

WILMINGTON DISTRICT.

BISHOP AND BRETHREN:-

The report of the Wilmington District is inadequate to our desire and effort to make it what it should be. The district is unnecessarily small, and one-third of it is very sterile. Most of the poor charges are pastored by men who are much more concerned about what they are to receive from than what they are to contribute to them. The pastor who serves a charge for a living, and does not by patient toil and unselfish devotion to his calling, contribute an equivalent, yea, more than he receives, makes the charge poorer. He has no right to reap where he has not sown. To strengthen the charge spiritually, numerically and financially is the pastor's special business, and failing to do this, he is a stone of stumbling, retarding the advance of the church.

The Disciplinary provisions for training the young people have been generally observed. The increased number of Sunday School Superintendent's reports, submitted to our Quarterly Conferences, the greater expenditures for Sunday School literature, and the formation of ten Teacher's Training Classes on the district, indicate more than ordinary interest in Sunday School work. Brother M. C. Jennings, our Field Secretary, organized a Sunday School of 38 scholars at Marshallton, Del., and if carefully nurtured it will, in the near future, become an important church.

The Junior Leagues of Ezion, Mt. Joy, Haven, Smyrna, Dover and Galena charges, are doing praiseworthy services in training the children, and bringing them into a relation of intelligent sympathy with our particular form of Christianity. In many homes the Bible is as a sealed book. Our people do not know the Scriptures. The majority of our young people never read the Bible. Our Class Leaders make no intelligent use of it in exhorting, reproving and comforting those whose experiences they hear in the Class Meetings. There is no hopeful future for a people, who do no earnestly seek to know, and do God's will as it is revealed in the Holy Scriptures. Ignorance of the Scriptures invites spiritual dearth, moral decline mental imbecility and everything else that tends to degenerate a people People who do not search the Scripitures, and who do not accept them as a rule of faith and practice, deprive themselves of the only certain source of strength, and are doomed to failure.

There is no duty more incumbent on our preachers than teaching our people the Scriptures. Much of the superstition connected with the religious life of our fathers, was awe-striking to the ungodly, but it has little on no influence on the ungodly of this generation, who respect only that which appeals to reason in matters of religion. This is a crucial period in the religious life of the Negro. We have it on good authority that, considering the increase in the Negro population, accessions to the church are less than they were ten years ago. The Negro, losing faith in the traditions which once seemed productive of piety, needs now more than ever, to know the scriptures that he may be saved from unbelief. The world fails to fully realize how much it owes to the teachings of the New Testament and the spirit of Christianity. It is no exaggeration to assert that, whatever distress or suffering we may think of, the Christian religion has in all probability, anticipated us and provided for it. The spirit of Christianity is responsible for the existence of hospitals, colleges and universities.

Education is our paramount need. We do not fully realize the bane of ignorance. Opportunities for training our boys and girls are exceedingly meagre, and especially so in the country, but even those are not made the most of. There are too many parents who do not compel their children to attend school.

The Carnegie proposition merits much more support than we have given it. It is doubtful whether all of our pastors have done their best to interest their people in the \$50,000 which Mr. Andrew Carnegie purposes to give to Morgan College, if an equal amount can be raised by its patrons Failure or indifference in a matter having so much to do with the training of our young people is nothing less than criminal. Thrown in competition

with those whose noble deeds glow on every page of history, and those who frequently deny us a square deal, we cannot make our way without a liberal training which enables us to do things as well, yea a little better than our competitors.

There are six young people of the Wilmington District attending our Quite a number of our young people are being trained in the Delaware State College for Colored Students, at the head of which is Dr. W. C. Jason, a member of our Conference. Martin Luther discussing the criminality of unnecessary ignorance said: "Now if thou hast a child that is fit to receive instruction and art able to hold him to it, and dost not, but goest thy way and carest not what snall become of the secular government, its laws, its peace, etc., thou warrest against the secular government, as much as in thee lies, like the Turk, yea, like the Devil himself. For thou withholdest from the kingdom, principality, country, city, a redeemer, comfort, corner-stone, helper and savior. And on thy account the emperor loses both sword and crown, the country loses safe-guard and freedom, and thou art the man through whose fault, as much as in thee lies, no man shall hold his body, wife, child, house, home and goods in safety. Rather thou sacrificest all these without ruth in the shambles, and givest cause that men shall become mere beasts, and at last devour one another. This all thou wilt assuredly do, if thou withdraw thy child from so wholesome a condition."

Charges.

BARCLAY. More than five years ago this charge built a parsonage, and because of its many failures to meet its financial obligations, the creditors became impatient and threatened to sell. It appears that the strenuous efforts to save the parsonage minified the ministerial support and the benevolent collections. Raised on old debts \$112. Conference collections \$50. Carnegie Fund \$2. Accessions 12. A. W. Lowber, pastor.

CATLIN has done remarkably well under the present administration. Three rooms have been added to the parsonage. Nearly all the framing was given by white friends. The pastor is a carpenter and did most of the work. This charge now has a very comfortable parsonage, and that at a very small cost to the members. Raised for improvements \$101. Ministerial support and the benevolent collections full. Conference collections \$91. Carnegie Fund \$8. Accessions 11. W. T. Spellman, pastor.

CHESWOLD is far in the arrears. In a very limited sense do any of the people of this charge realize "that it is more blessed to give than to receive." The pastor and his family have really suffered for the things which life demands. There is, by reason of the pastor's consistent life among the people, and the Gospel which he has preached to them, a growing appreciation on the part of the people for nobler things. Conference collections \$22. S. Hammond, pastor.

COLEMAN, formerly a charge of the Centreville District, was at the last session of the Conference added to the Wilmington District to increase

the number of charges thereon. The change has been mutually helpfu The charge records a year of unparalleled success. Repaired, and addethree rooms to the parsonage at a cost of \$500, and paid \$200 on the same Advanced pastor's salary to \$600. Conference collections \$112. Carnegi-Fund \$25. Accessions 15. W. E. Waters, pastor.

CRUMPTON has not done well. The pastor for reasons which he into wholly responsible, failed to enlist the sympathy and cooperation of hippeople. Ministerial support and the benevolent collections are painfulledeficient. Conference collections \$25. Accessions 1. C. O. Waters, pastor

DELAWARE CITY. The church at St. George's, Del., was locked against the pastor when he returned at the close of last Conference session. He had, before going to Conference, secured the services of the well known "wild man" for special revival work, and the trouble which followed, pluse the liberal collections which his congregation gave the evangelist was the price the pastor had to pay. The church remained closed only a short while, but the membership has shown but little interest in church work-Raised on old indebtedness \$142. Conference collections \$70. Carnegies Fund \$20. Accessions 1. T. B. H. Coleman, pastor.

DOVER. There has been a decrease of three in the membership of this charge. The ministerial support as usual is according to estimate and the benevolent collections are full. Conference collections \$123. Carnegie Fund \$30. Accessions 3. E. H. Webb, pastor.

DOVER CIRCUIT, which advanced to First Class last year, will not be classified this year. The pastor's feebleness is responsible for the retrogression. Conference collections \$26. Carnegie Fund \$2. Accessions 3.S. W. Waters, pastor.

GALENA is still advancing. Its spiritual and financial condition is healthy. The new church at Davis' Hill has been painted. Paid on old debt \$480. Conference collections \$100. Carnegie Fund \$45. Accessions 9. J. W. Jefferson, pastor.

MARYDEL has suffered greatly by reason of the pastor's protracted illness. His affliction has apparently weakened his mind. His memory is very defective. Raised on old debts \$55. Conference collections \$50. Carnegie Fund \$5. W. H. Turner, pastor.

MIDDLETOWN is pressing on the upward way. Two rooms have been added to the parsonage. The exterior of the church has been painted. Raised for improvements \$200, and on old indebtedness \$100. Conference collections \$75. Carnegie Fund \$30. Accessions 11. J. U. King, pastor.

MILLINGTON has not receded from the high place it won last year. The pastor and people are like ants, they do their work in Summer. A lot has been purchased in Chesterville Grove, where the people live, and the church, which is two miles distant, will be moved and erected thereon. Raised for improvements \$100. Conference collection \$100. Carnegie Fund \$6. Accessions 8. A. J. Wallace, pastor.

NEW CASTLE started well, but the ending is not what the beginning seemed to predict. While a much better work has been done this year than last, there is as usual a shortage in ministerial support and the benevolent collections. Raised on old debts \$100. Conference collections \$55. Carnegie Fund \$15. Accessions 2. M. W. Clark, pastor.

NEWPORT, according to its strength, has done well. The members rented a parsonage in Wilmington and partially furnished the same. Conference collections \$37. Accessions 2. H. T. Johnson, pastor.

ODESSA is waning. Zoar, the church in town, desires to become a station. That it would, with an energetic young pastor, do a more effective work is unquestionable. Conference collections \$52. Carnegie Fund \$12. Accessions 2. O. P. Dickerson, pastor.

PORT DEPOSIT began well this year, and doubtless would have ended the same but for the swelling of the Susquehanna, and the disastrous flood which followed. Raised on old debts \$200. Conference collections \$60. Carnegie Fund \$10. Accessions 2. W. E. Hilton, pastor.

SASSAFRAS. Two churches, one in Sassafras, and the other in Poplar Neck, have done fairly well, but the church at Warwick has not given the pastor an audience for months. The work as a whole has not been a success. Conference collections \$15. Carnegie Fund \$5. Accessions 7. J. M. Whittington, pastor.

SMYRNA delights in working for the Master. It has witnessed many dark days, but it now rejoices for the light has come. The members are loyal and liberal. Raised for improvements \$30. Conference collections \$50. Carnegie Fund \$31. Accessions 10. W. H. Johns, pastor.

STILL POND is another strong charge, which was added to this district the last Conference session, and judging from the work accomplished this year, it would seem that it has lost none of its former vigor. Ministerial support advanced. Conference collections \$102. Carnegie Fund \$40. Accessions 12. F. T. Johnson, pastor.

TOWNSEND. Influenced by the former pastor who seemed determined not to leave the charge, some of the officials notified the present pastor not to appear. He rightly ignored the notice and went to his appointment, but found no welcome there. Despite insults, treachery, sickness in his family, and want of support, for he received only \$10 during the second quarter, this man of God was ever found at his post of duty. For months he sowed in tears, but never a word of complaint. He is a hero. About the middle of the year the people began to realize the worth of the man the Conference had assigned them, and then they began to work with a will, but could not atone for the time wasted in useless warfare. The Fourth Quarterly Conference unanimously voted for his return. Paid on old debts \$109. Conference collections \$56. Carnegie Fund \$6. Accessions 6. P. W. Price, pastor.

WILMINGTON, EZION. This charge can always be depended upon for doing its full share. Frequently has it struggled hard to maintain its reputation, but this year's great success, seems to have been quite easily achieved, because harmony reigns supreme among the people, which condition is largely due to the wisdom of the pastor. So far as the benevolent collections are concerned this charge has been ready for Conference more than three months. The unusual interest which scores of young people manifest in Systematic Bible Study, is a most hopeful sign of the church's growth. The spiritual atmosphere of the charge is wholesome. Ministerial support is according to estimate and the benevolent collections are full. Conference collections \$870. Carnegie Fund \$160. African Diamond Jubilee \$70. Accessions 18. N. W. Moore, pastor.

WILMINGTON, HAVEN. The financial affairs of this charge are in better condition than they were one year ago, but nothing less than the people's best will enable them to meet their many financial obligations. They are still worshipping in the basement. Circumstances are not altogether lovely, but the pastor has done his best to have them so. Conference collections \$90. Carnegie Fund \$15. Accessions 6. E. O. Parker, pastor.

WILMINGTON, MT. JOY. When the present pastor was assigned to this charge seven years ago, no preacher envied him, but since it has developed into one of the most desirable appointments on the district, some of the brethren are saying "it is time for him to move." The Third Quarterly Conference voted that the present pastor be returned to the charge for the eighth year. A new Estey organ at a cost of \$450 has been purchased for the church, and a new piano costing \$300 has been bought for the Sunday School. Conference collections \$114. Carnegie Fund \$26. African Diamond Jubilee \$30. Accessions 1. W. J. L. Hughes, pastor.

SUMMARY. Raised for Foreign Missions \$502. Home Missions and Church Extension \$450. Freedman's Aid \$231. Carnegie Fund \$522. African Diamond Jubilee \$100. Accessions 128. We worked and prayed for better results, by no means are we satisfied with these. We are not discouraged, we are going to try again, and God helping us we shall do better the next time. A most cordial relation exists between me and my fellow-laborers. Their many expressions of good will and confidence have contributed much to my happiness and strengthened me to do the work assigned me.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

of the

DELAWARE CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH Incorporated.

First:—The name of this corporation is the Delaware Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Incorporated.

Second:—Its principal office or place of business in the State of Delaware is to be located in or near the town of Dover, County of Kent, the agent in charge thereof is William C. Jason, of near Dover, Delaware.

Third:—The nature of the business and the objects and purposes proposed to be transacted, promoted and carried on, are to do any and all the things herein mentioned as fully and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and in any part of the world, namely:

- (a) To disseminate, encourage and sustain the blessings of Christianity, morality and education.
- (b) To erect, equip, maintain, own and hold churches, chapels and other places of religious worship.
- (c) To erect, maintain, equip, own and hold parsonages, halls and other buildings for religious and literary purposes.
- (d) To erect, equip, maintain and hold buildings and grounds for educational, charitable and literary purposes.
- (e) To erect, equip, maintain, own and hold cottages, tents and other buildings for religious, educational and literary purposes.
- (f) To take, receive and hold any real or personal property by virtue of any devise or bequest contained in any last will or testament of any person whomsoever, and wherever said property, real or personal, may be situated, either within or without the State of Delaware.
- (g) To act as trustee in respect to any devise or bequest pertaining to the objects and purposes of this Corporation, and devises and bequests of real or personal property may be made directly to this Corporation or to it in trust for any of the objects and purposes comprehended herein, and such trusts may continue without limit as to time.
- (h) To take, own, hold, deal in, mortgage or otherwise lien, and to lease, sell, exchange, transfer, or in any manner whatever dispose of real property within or without the State of Delaware wheresoever situated.
- (i) To take, receive, accept, own and hold personal or mixed property of any and every kind or description, and to lease, sell, exchange, transfer or in any manner whatever dispose of the same.
 - (j) To accumulate a fund by devises, bequests, gifts, grants, contribu-

tions or donations, or otherwise, for the purpose of carrying out the objects and purposes of this Corporation or any of them.

- (k) To accumulate, hold and disburse the funds of this Corporation and to transact all other business authorized by this charter, under such conditions, laws, rules and regulations as the Board of Trustees of this Corporation may see proper and necessary from time to time to enact.
- (1) To invest the whole or any part of the funds of this Corporation in such security or securities as the Board of Trustees may from time to time direct, with the power to call in and reinvest the same.
- (m) To have offices, conduct its business and promote its objects with—in and without the State of Delaware, in other States, the District of Colum—bia, the territories and colonies of the United States and in foreign coun—tries, without restriction as to place or amount.
- (n) To do any or all of the things herein set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and in any part of the world, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, or otherwise, and either alone or in company with others.
- (o) In General to carry on any other business in connection therewith, of any and every kind, not forbidden by the laws of the State of Delaware, and with all the powers conferred upon corporations by the laws of the State of Delaware.

Fourth:—This Corporation shall have no capital stock. The members of this Corporation shall be in the first instance and until the annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the year nineteen hundred and ten, the incorporators, and thereafter such persons as then are or may thereafter be members of the Delaware Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Fifth:—The names and places of residence of each of the incorporators are:—

James H. Scott, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Charles A. Tindley, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Noah W. Moore, Wilmington, Delaware. Frederick H. Butler, Montclair, New Jersey. Storer S. Jolly, Newark, New Jersey. John H. Nutter, Chester, Pennsylvania. Joseph R. Waters, Germantown, Pennsylvania. John R. Brown, Milford, Delaware. William C. Jason, Dover, Delaware.

Sixth: - The existence of this Corporation is to be perpetual.

Seventh:—The private property of the incorporators and members of this Corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatever.

Eighth:—The incorporators shall constitute the Board of Trustees of this Corporation until the annual session of the Delaware Annual Confer-

ence of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the year nineteen hundred and ten, or until their successors shall be duly elected. At the annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference in the year nineteen hundred and ten, whether held within or without the State of Delaware, there shall be elected three trustees for the term of three years to take the places of William C. Jason, Joseph R. Waters and John R. Brown, and at the annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference in the year nineteen hundred and eleven there shall be elected three trustees for the term of three years to take the places of Frederick H. Butler, Storer S. Jolly and John H. Nutter, and at the annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference in the year nineteen hundred and twelve there shall be elected three trustees for the term of three years to take the places of James H.Scott, Charles A. Tindley and Noah W. Moore, and at each annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference thereafter three trustees shall be elected to take the places of the trustees whose terms shall then expire. A failure to elect trustees at any session of the said Delaware Annual Conference the trustees whose terms would then expire shall continue to hold office as such until their successors shall be duly elected, and also all vacancies occurring in the Board of Trustees in the interim of any annual session of the said Delaware Annual Conference shall be filled by the remaining members of the Board, the persons so elected to fill such vacancies shall hold office only up to the time of the election of their successors which shall be done at the next meeting of the said Delaware Annual Conference, when their office shall be held as vacant and shall be filled by the members of the said Delaware Annual Conference, and provided also, that should any of the members of the said Board of Trustees cease to be a member of the said Delaware Annual Conference, his office as a member of the Board of Trustees of this Corporation shall at the same time cease.

Ninth:—The Board of Trustees shall have power to make, alter and amend the By-Laws, to fix the amount to be reserved as working capital, and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgages and liens, without limit as to amount, upon the property and franchises of this Corporation. The By-Laws shall determine whether or not and to what extent the accounts and books of this Corporation, or any of them, shall be open to teh inspection of the members of this Corporation, and no member shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of this Corporation except as conferred by law or by the By-Laws or by resolution of its members. The members and Boards of Trustees shall have power to hold their meetings and keep the books, documents and papers of the Corporation outside of the State of Delaware at such places as may be from time to time designated by the By-Laws or by resolution of the members or Board of Trustees, except as otherwise required by the laws of the State of Delaware.


